James: Oh, boy! I wish you were sitting here with all these wonderful people. We are so glad you give Betty and me, James Robison, the opportunity of coming into your home. *LIFE Today*, we talk about life every day and we want you to experience life.

Think about this, Jesus came that we might have life and have it abundantly. He came to give us that abundant life and right now, he is seated at the right hand of the father daily making intercession for you. God cares about you, wherever you are. I'll make you a promise, just give us a chance today to share his heart, his love, his concern for you.

This is "Wednesdays with Beth." Beth Moore is going to share: Wrecked but Not Ruined. Paul the apostle had a shipwreck but he wasn't ruined. That shipwreck actually got him somewhere he needed to be and perhaps it was the only way he would get there.

Beth: Now what was number one? Sometimes we're what?

Audience: Standing in the exact spot where several storms collide.

Beth: -- Where several storms collide. Sometimes we're standing in the exact spot where several storms collide. Would anybody say that's true?

Number two is this: The question of fault feeds the fury of every storm. The question of fault feeds the fury of every storm. Jot that down. Now say it back to me.

Beth and audience: The question of fault feeds the fury of every storm.

Beth: I want to ask you if that's true today. Because I want you to think this through: whatever your storm may be, and I want you to think God's bringing this message to you at this time because of the exact circumstances you are presently in.

So relate it right now to your circumstances. So what are the storms that are colliding right over your sweet little head at this moment? And I want to ask you a question. How many

are you in all by yourself? And what I'd like to present to you is not very many. Really, storms require some people involved. Because let me tell you our circumstantial problems are not near as big as our relational problems. They're in a whole different league, a whole different need of the spirit when we're dealing with people than just circumstances.

So often, what will happen in the midst of storms is that we'll find that we are somehow related and interconnected with a group of people going through this thing, only we're all going through it our own way. So we've got this corporate storm – this is what happened on this ship in Acts 27. This corporate storm, 276 people on board. But all of them were going through it in their own individual way. Wouldn't you believe that's got to be true?

And it occurred to me as I was thinking this through, that if we'd been around the same group long enough, say in a family situation, when storms come and everybody starts reacting, isn't it true that in a group that we're familiar with – this can be true at work, it can be true in a ministry – that we'll have roles. That there's the person that you know is going to completely wig in a heartbeat. I mean, you've got your screamer, you've got your fixer, you've got your cleaner-upper, the one that is going to clean it up, you've got your motivator, you've got your rock, you've got your hider, you've got your brooder, you've got the one that is going to go to bed. I mean you've just got --. But wouldn't you say that so often in our groups we all have roles.

If you really want to freak your family out just do a different one than they're use to. Just like this time I can remember vividly in my family, in my family of origin as an adult woman, that I just went, "You know what? I'm not fixing this one!" Because I was the fix-- I was the motivational one in the family. I was just going to cheer us all --. You know, when everybody's not wanting to get their pom-poms out, you know the cheerleader gets tired of cheering. Anybody know what I'm talking about? Like whoa, yeah! Yeah!

So, I just finally got over it and everybody just like went to pieces. You must hate us now. No, I'm just tired. Anybody? Just get tired.

But here's what happened. When there is more than one person involved in any storm, whoa, you just got somebody to blame. That's what happens because we want it to be somebody's fault. Somebody needs to pay when we're in a storm. Somebody needs to pay! And like who put us here? Who got us in this situation? There's got to be somebody to blame. Somehow that is just a natural part of us. We're going to look for a person that we can point to.

I want you to look back in this account because you have to look up before our reading to catch what's happening here. Acts 27, now go with me to 9 to 12, verses 9 to 12 of that same segment. It says – this is beforehand, before we get into that northeaster.

9 Much time had been lost, and sailing had already become dangerous because by now it was after the Fast.

So that was going to be after the day of atonement, which would have been at the end of September so we already know it's in October.

So Paul warned them, 10 "Men, I can see that our voyage is going to be disastrous and bring great loss to ship and cargo, and to our own lives also." 11 But the centurion, instead of listening to what Paul said, followed the advice of the pilot and of the owner of the ship.

Now I love this because we want to go, "They should have listened to Paul!"

Listen, wouldn't you want to listen to the actual captain of the ship. I mean, does Paul have to know everything? I'm just asking you! Just everything? I mean, like what would make him think, "We should listen to Paul."? They didn't realize that God was talking to Paul but no, the pilot, owner of the ship said, "We should go." We did it.

12 Since the harbor was unsuitable to winter in, the majority decided that we should sail on, hoping to reach Phoenix and winter there. This was a harbor in Crete, facing both southwest and northwest.

Let me tell you something: the majority is not always right. The majority is not always right! Now here's what could happen because there's a whole lot of blame going on here. I mean, why didn't they follow his advice? And why did they do what he said? And there's just nothing like Paul to bring in a good, "I knew it was going to be disastrous!" And I want to prove to you he's going to say, "I told you so!"

Would you pick up with me in verse 21? I love the apostle Paul in the pages of scripture! I love him! These are things I love about him right here.

21 After the men had gone a long time without food, Paul stood up before them and said: "Men, you should have taken my advice not to sail from Crete; then you would have spared yourselves this damage and loss. 22 But now I urge you to keep up your courage, because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed. 23 Last night an angel of the God whose I am and whom I serve stood beside me 24 and said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul. You must stand trial before Caesar; and God has graciously given you the lives of all who sail with you.' 25 So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me. 26 Nevertheless, we must run aground on some island."

Now, there are so many things I love about this. For one thing, I love that he didn't know what island. God had already told him everything else, but it was like, "But I have no idea where we're going to land." No idea! I mean, like sometimes when you have a word for somebody they want to know everything else with it. And you're going, "I only know the one word! I only know the one word."

I want to point something out to you. Paul told them in the very beginning, back in that first portion in Acts 27 in verse 10, he had said that there was going to be great loss of life. Well, no there wasn't. So I just wanted to say something about your resident know-it-all: some people know a lot but nobody knows it all. So I would like for us all to be just relaxed in that and know, especially if it's us, to stop it. But if it's someone else, and we all have one, that we just – the frustration of they can't always be right. Not even Paul was always right. He thought there would be great loss of life and there was not but God came back and gave him a word and he got a big, "I told you so," right back in the middle of it but there was hope! There was hope!

And here's what we've got to know: that no matter who's fault it is or what a waste of time and energy, an emotional velocity, when we're just trying to blame and place fault but no matter whose fault it is, God in his sovereignty sends us through storms to a place we would never land otherwise. That we have got to know. That we've got to take home to momma. That one, that one we have got to settle in our hearts that, no matter what, our God is sovereign and if he went to all the trouble to make sure that this wind would come from this direction and this one would come from this direction so that we would move this way – this way, not this way, not this way, this way because of those two winds coming together and he knows we're going to run aground on exactly the place he wants us to land. That has got to be where our faith finds its courage. Sometimes we're standing in the exact spot where several storms collide.

Secondly, the question of fault feeds the fury of every single storm.

I cannot tell you the blessing it is to us when we just come to terms with some of the sovereignty of God to know that he works in us. I want you to write down, in case somebody isn't going to know this verse today, this is going to be new to you.

I wish I could see your face right now because it's this kind of thing that just turns the light on for somebody. Philippians 2:13, I want to read this verse to you in hopes that this is going to be new to somebody.

13 for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose.

I want to say that again to you. And no matter what you're going through as those storms are coming together right over your head, God is doing something! God is up to something! And even though people may have blown it to your right and blown it to your left you've got to know in his sovereignty he has let you be standing, right there in the apex, right there, right there were they collided because he has a place to blow you. You are not going otherwise. I've got to know that. I've got to trust that. That has got to be where my hope comes from.

Number three is this: the titanic temptation – and there's just a little pun there. My girls call me the queen of puns. I love puns. The titanic temptation in any storm is to give way to it. The titanic temptation in any storm is to just give way to it. I want you to look back. Jot that down. In fact, I want you to read it back to me. The titanic temptation in any storm is to give way to it.

I want you look back at verses 14 and 15 again, I want you to hear these words.

14 Before very long, a wind of hurricane force, called the "northeaster," swept down from the island. 15 The ship was caught by the storm and could not head into the wind; so we gave way to it and were driven along.

Just give way to it in panic, in defeat or just in a bad mood. Anybody know what I'm talking about? Just like in a bad mood. Where you just decide, "What can I do? I'm just going to roll with the storm and I'm just going to let it toss me where ever I'm going to go." Instead of, "Lord, you lead me! You get me where you want me!"

If we just decide, I'm just going to like throw myself into the storm and go, "Have your way! Have your way with me!" And we let it just whatever comes naturally to us for nature to just take its way over us and we lapse totally back into our flesh patterns. What

is your pattern when you just give way? When you just cease to fight in the spirit and just give way to it? What is our pattern? It just means that we lapse back into those old addictions, those old coping mechanisms, place where we've had victory for years. We'll get in the middle of that storm and we'll all the sudden pick right back up in that old area of defeat because we cannot see our way through the wind and the rain and our salvation is coming! We have a rescuer! And our salvation is coming. We have the grace to be victorious.

And what happens so often when we're in a situation where storms are colliding on top of our sweet heads is that we feel so completely out of control that we think -- we talk ourselves into believing we have no choices here. Nothing could be further from the truth and I want to say this to you on the other side of the screen: I just wish so much that we were sitting across the coffee table from one another. We really do get to control a few things. And how we're going to react to it is first on the list. What we're going to do with the situation we're in, whether or not we're going to lapse back or whether we're going to choose to receive the grace that God would give us to get through this thing victoriously.

Listen, if you are in Christ, if you belong to God, and I'm going to tell you this, even if you've never trusted Jesus as your personal savior, you can do that today because God's wooing you or you wouldn't be on the other side of that screen watching this. That's the Holy Spirit pulling you, not just your remote control. Would somebody say amen to that? That's the Holy Spirit calling you. And God has planned something for you and there is no storm he ever lets you find yourself in the middle of that he does not have a victory for you. There is a way to be victorious here. There is way to be victorious. There is a way to see him come walking out on that water and to step out of that boat and walk to him. There is a way! There is a way! There is a way! There is a way! I'm not just going to give way to the wind and be tossed where ever it sends us. We're going to go where God leads that ship and see his grace.

I want you to look back at verses 22 and 25 where Paul says this:

22 But now I urge you to keep up your courage, because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed.

It's the wildest thing that whatever is carrying us there might be destroyed. Like you're going to go, "You know what? The very situation -- the work that I was in that led me to this city, I don't even work at that place anymore! He used that ship to get me here. That ship was destroyed and here I am. In exactly the place!"

Is that speaking to anybody? Exactly the place he wanted to lead me. The ship may get destroyed but you're going to land exactly where he purposes if you trust him! Keep up your courage. Keep up your courage.

It says in verse 25:

25 So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me.

I wonder if somebody watching or listening today remembers this faint promise that you felt God spoke over you years ago that you had given up on.

I feel like one of the things that God wanted me to say as we wrap up this part of our two part series, as we wrap up the first part was that we've let something go that was a promise that God still wants to keep.

I pray that somebody's got the courage to see the storm through to the other side and to not just give way to fear and not just to give way to panic but to know that your God is faithful, your God is faithful. What has he spoken over you?

Let me tell you something, if I'm not in the word I cannot hear him speaking. Constantly people will just look up into the skies almost with a lost-ness on their face and go, "Speak to me! Speak to me! Speak to me!"

Yes, he could probably do that, he could probably speak audibly from the heavenlies. He certainly could if he wanted to. But I've never one time heard him speak that way. This is how I hear him speak! He speaks to me through his word and then he'll use all sorts of things to confirm that word to me: circumstances and people that will come along and counsel me where that word is concerned. But this is how he speaks. The soundness and the beauty of his word.

I want to say this to you as we end this first part: I want you to love this book so much. This can be life and breath to you. The reason why I'm passionate about God's word is because he used it to save not only my life, he used it to save my mind. Anybody know what I'm talking about? Saved my mind! And I praise him! In such bondage to my sin and self-destruction. It was the pages of his word. He sent forth his word and he healed me. This is where your promise is. This is where he'll speak to you. This is where he will build up your faith. This is where you will find your courage.

I think very often there's so many verses that speak in the male sense to the "sons of God" but every now and then there's just one spoken straight to a woman and I love that.

We've got so many brothers with us in here today and I'm so blessed and so blessed to serve you on the other side of that screen but I want this also over the women: Luke 1:45.

45 Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!

Blessed are you, man or woman, when you believe that what God has spoken over you will be accomplished. There's somebody listening today that thinks that the storm is the very evidence that it's not going to come to pass! Maybe that very storm is going to blow you right to the place you're longing to be. It's never fun when we're in it but when we land someplace we know we could never have found on our own it is a beautiful, beautiful thing.

In the studio:

James: I think Beth hit the nail right on the head. You think that what's happening, I mean the difficulty, the valley, the challenge, the mountain, whatever it is is going to prevent or hinder when God purposes from occurring -- not so! We can experience all kind of challenges. I honestly believe those challenges become oftentimes steppingstones to the higher purposes of God.

Father, I pray that for every person that they will see what you will do with whatever a person is facing, however it got there. You are the way through the storm. You are the shelter in the storm. You are the shepherd. I pray everyone will grasp the reality of that truth. In Jesus' name.

Truth sets us free and you've just heard truth.

Betty, one of the great joys that we've experienced is sharing life and love with other people. One of the things that we've seen over and over, when you see a hurt you see a disease, you see a sick child, nothing moves you anymore than a child fighting, maybe they've lost their hair because of chemo and we're trying to find the cure. You say, oh, I would do anything!

What if you knew beyond any doubt you had the perfect cure for what you see, however painful. Well, we do. But get this, you have the cure. It's in your hand. The answer is in your hand and in your heart.

I want you to watch, I want you to see the need but you really have the answer. You are the answer. Watch closely.

James: I know that there are some people, they see those images and they run -- I do too! I run to get a checkbook. I run to get a bankcard. I've run with my wife to the ends of the earth. Not to look at them... to love them. ...To save their lives! And not just tell them about God's love but show it to them.

But then I would hear the cry that you just heard and I knew they were hurting. Immediately, as a mother I wanted to get up and fix whatever the problem was being caused for those tears, for that heartache.

I feel like those mothers every time they hear their baby whimper, that soft cry because they're so weak they can't cry real loud. That mother's heart is breaking because she can't fix their hurt. You know something? We can. We're able to and we must fix the hurtful cries of these babies. They're hungry. Their little bodies need nourishment.

So I hope you will see what God wants you to do about joining with us and let's fix the problem. The problem is they're hungry.

James: And it is so easy to fix. Love corrects it -- food corrects it.

Betty was talking about them crying, and a lot of times they get so weak they can't cry. They just whimper.

And the little lullaby, a little song that the Somalians sing is "Go to sleep so you won't hurt anymore." There's a sleep they never wake up from.
