In the studio:

James: I want to welcome you to a very special *LIFE Today*. You see, we've been praying very specifically. You've heard me say many times because you watch us touching suffering people all over the world as well as hearing the most interesting guests and testimonies, and hopefully what Betty and I share is inspirational and meaningful. You tell us it is and it's obvious, because you identify with what's on our heart that God put there, what's actually on His heart and you help us extend His hands. I've said that many times, "express His heart by extending His hands."

But many, many people all over the world have said, "James, there is some economic uncertainty and we feel it. We feel the challenge. Some of our family does, and we really want you to pray for us." Well, as we pray and we have. We've taken it very seriously. And any time you call that number that's paid for by love... by somebody like you who says, "I want there to be a prayer line where serious people will focus on specific needs and pray with and for people." So it's there. Some are already calling it now even while I'm talking to you because they need a specific prayer answered.

But in answer to your prayers and your requests, we asked God to show us how we might be able to put something not only in your heart but in your hands that could go to your heart, to your mind and really give you some stability and security and some direction. So we put together a series, teaching, how to address certain financial challenges and concerns, how to get divine direction when you face serious challenges. *MORE than ENOUGH* was the result of that.

God says through Paul to the Corinthian Christians, "I will give you not only enough to meet your needs, if you become a person involved in a ministry of giving, living/giving, giving/living, releasing the river. Jesus said, "Rivers of life flow out of you." Rivers of love: meet the needs of others, assist the suffering, the downtrodden, the widows, the orphans, care for the helpless, the homeless, the hungry, the thirsty. And we're able to do that and that is precisely what we do together.

But many of you have said, “James, we need help.” So we found the teaching where God says He’ll not only meet your needs but He’ll give you more than enough so you can meet the needs of others. We brought together the most gifted teachers on finances. Many of them have been our guests, and we put all these resources together in the series, *MORE than ENOUGH*. As well as making available to you some incredible books that will give you insight from the book, the word of God but where you’ll know how to apply it. You’re going to be hearing from these gifted individuals and learn about *MORE than ENOUGH*.

Now I want you to hear one of the most enjoyable guests Betty and I have ever talked to. This is a Jewish rabbi. If anybody understands financial management, how to be blessed when it comes to resources, and I’m telling you what he shares from the word of God and in his book about prosperity... you don’t want to miss this! Let’s join the program Betty and I did with Rabbi Lapin.

Previously taped segment:

James: Would you welcome Rabbi Lapin to *LIFE Today*? Daniel, Rabbi, good to see you.

[Applause]

I want you to just take off with some of these Ten Commandments. You literally say these are the Ten Commandments for making money, for having prosperity, which is more than just stuff. It is real life.

Rabbi Lapin: You put your finger on it when you said, “Look, we could read books by Bill Gates and we could read books by Donald Trump and we could read books by...”

James: Buffett?

Rabbi Lapin: Buffett, exactly! It doesn't help me because I'm not as smart as Bill Gates and I don't have the capital of Buffett and my dad didn't leave me 3,000 apartments in New York like Donald Trump -- it doesn't help me.

But what does help me is to study what millions of ordinary people have done, millions of ordinary Jewish individuals have done through hundreds and hundreds of years, even in countries with oppression. You'd have to be a blind immigrant from

outer Mongolia not to know that Jews are disproportionately good with money. Don't you say that?

James: That's why you're right here trying to help us all out.

Rabbi Lapin: I'm allowed to say that because I'm an Orthodox Jewish Rabbi.

[Laughter]

But the point is what is the reason? Obviously, there are poor Jews. But demographically there ought to be eight or nine Jews on the Forbes 400 list. In fact, we have about 100 every year. There is a reason for that and that's not because you have to have chicken soup or you've got to be circumcised or anything like that. It's because there are thousands of principles and tips and tools and techniques and timeless truths embedded throughout scripture and all of ancient Jewish wisdom, which I felt somebody needed to condense, somebody needed to reduce into a manageable -- now it is not an easy book. There is a lot of material. You're not going to read it on Monday and make more money on Tuesday. But if you read it and study it over the next month, this year will be a better year for you than last year, no question about it. That's what we're talking about.

Now specifically where do we start? You made the point in our conversations of is this only for people of a certain age or people of certain talents? No, that's the whole point. This is not for the computer wizards or anybody else. This is you and me; this is ordinary people learning to operate the way God wants us to operate. This is not sitting around doing nothing and saying, "God, please give me money." Because I don't think God responds to that.

God says, "I've told you what I want you to do. I want you to care for other people. I want you to be obsessively preoccupied with other people's needs and above all I don't want you to think that your virtue is compromised because you're going to make a profit of taking care of other people." So learn that the word is not what you want, the word is service.

One of the worst pieces of advice they ever give to young people leaving school is, "I don't know what I'm going to do."

"No problem! Find out what you're passionate about and go and do that."

Look, as an employer, somebody comes to me and says, "Let me tell you, I want a job with you. Why don't I start off telling you what I'm passionate about?"

No, I don't want to hear what you're passionate about. I don't actually care what you're passionate about. I've a business to run. I only have one question and that is, can you help me? Why don't people get that?

I have watched job interviews where the applicant walks in and starts off three minutes into the conversation, "Excuse me, can I find out what are the benefits? What are the vacation days?" Well, that's a fine message you're sending me. The message is, you're not working for me ever!

[Laughter]

That's for sure! There is a right way to ask for a raise. There is a right way to do it. You start off with gratitude. We learn this from scripture. How do we ask God for anything when we pray? We start off with appreciation and praise. If you're already working somewhere, you've benefited from that company. You need to go in and you need to talk about how much you appreciate the company. Then you need to go in and talk about ways in which you can be of added service to the company. That's the word, "service."

What you can -- there are right and wrong ways to ask for a raise. Most people do it wrong. Starting a business, there is no reason why anybody can't start a business on the side. You don't have to quit your job. All you've got to do is sit down, either with yourself or with your C.E.O. who is your spouse or your board of directors who might be your family, and sit down and have a serious brainstorming session of what is needed. What do people miss? What could people's lives be improved by by the things you do?

So step number one is recognizing that the goal is not money, the goal is serving other people. Money is the automatic consequence. The love of money gets you on the wrong track. It is not going to work. I don't want to do business with you if all your interested in is my money.

James: See, I have had from the time I actually was called to preach, it's obvious that it seemed like I had a gift to communicate. If you think the business world didn't recognize that and come to get that gift to utilize it, there is no question about it. But here's what I did because I was called to do something God called me to do.

But I opted out of Social Security when I was 18 so I didn't make any plans for retirement. But let me just say this, up in my 50s advisors said, "You need to do some things." And I began to say I've heard and learned some things and somebody told me, "Well, a good investment is something that will never be anything ever made like that again." So I kind of thought there might be without high speculation land and some other things. I began to make some good decisions.

But let me tell you what really worked and it is really a reemphasis of what you said. I began to try to find people that I could simply offer something to with no thought, at the moment, of what it might do for me but what I could do for them. It is amazing how attracted they were to the counsel or the advice. I even found some that I would give them advice with a legitimate interest in the service they wanted to offer or the job they wanted to accomplish.

Now Rabbi, this was an amazing thing to see. There was some, and I can think of one in particular who said, "You helped me so much -- I mean you so revolutionized my ability to help others, to do something meaningful, to make a literal difference on planet earth in people's lives for the good that I want to actually compensate you." So frankly, they've compensated Betty and me for simply the counsel and the advice that impacted... and frankly, it's impacted hundreds of thousands of people. Is that not what you're talking about?

What I'm saying is I wasn't looking for a job per se, I mean I had a job but I realized I didn't trust Social Security and that means we're going to have to start looking in the future, not those of you that have been expecting and we've been -- I'm going to fight to find a way to be sure you get what you expect.

But also to encourage, we began to reorganize programs that were not working -- you cannot keep doing business the way we're doing it right now as a nation. You'll agree with that. We've got to make correction. We're going to have to sit down and reason together and all of us pull together.

My point is I began to offer the very service you're talking about and found an immediate connectedness, which that's one of your commandments, not connections, but connectedness for the benefit of one another. Take off on something else in the book. I'm excited about what you're saying!

Rabbi Lapin: I'm excited at your excitement!

[Laughter]

-- Because it is so terrific to be with people who get it. It's so obvious. It shouldn't be necessary to have to prove.

But one of the ways of proving that these Judeo-Christian principles that emerge from scripture are absolutely the way to build wealth is a very simple fact and I've discussed this with world-renowned economists at various conferences I've spoken at and nobody has been able to -- or would dispute this. No capital market has ever grown indigenously in a non-Christian society. So there is a stock exchange in Singapore now, there is a stock exchange in Nigeria. Sure, that's true! But these were all emulations of a capital system that grew up in the west and the west was a child of the Bible. That's a very important point.

James: Which means each one of us, as children of God, as people God created, whether you trusted him or trusted in him or not, for heaven's sake, trust the laws that are as certain and absolute as gravity. The weight of God's truth will keep everything in proper place and proper alignment. The standard of God is the proper measure of everything. We need to be plowing toward that standard. It is the Judeo-Christian principles and ethics.

We need to get back to building on that regardless of what you believe. It is a solid foundation. If you're going to rise above the law of gravity you put another law of aerodynamics in effect. If you don't do it and you don't put it that in effect, you're coming down. And we are violating the principles in the Word of God. We are violating the very principles upon which this nation was built to be the most prosperous ever. I'm telling you, we've got to get back to it. I want to be a part of leading people back into the light of truth.

Rabbi Lapin: And you're doing that through your wonderful books, the books the two of you have written together and you're doing it through this show. I think by making *Thou Shalt Prosper* available to people who help, you're helping people get past this.

James: Betty, you jump in the mix. You want to ask the Rabbi something? I know you always say, "I'm a great listener. I like to hear what's being said." What are you prompted to ask him today?

Betty: You're talking about prospering. To me that takes in so much more than the money side of it but it is prospering in our relationship with God. And if you're a parent or a grandparent, I know, at least James and I, we have three children and 11

grandchildren and it is our desire that they all prosper. We look at their whole character, their gifts that God has given them, and we want them to prosper in life, and that includes financially. Why? Because sometimes I get concerned, Rabbi, that we're being taught to just take instead of give.

Rabbi Lapin: Well, this is exactly the point. With audiences I sometimes like saying, "Hands up everybody who wants to make more money." Everybody starts sliding under their seats. Everyone is embarrassed to put their hands up. Why?

Think about this for a moment. I say to everybody, "All right, take out a dollar and hold it up." Then I have to reassure them, "There is not going to be a collection. This is not an offering. I just want to do a demonstration."

Okay fine, now they take the dollars out. And I fool them at the end. I ask them to pass them all up to the front.

[Laughter]

But what I'm saying is, if you stole that money, if you robbed somebody to get that money, put it away. If you defrauded somebody put it away. If you mugged a little old lady and took her pocketbook and that's how you got that dollar bill, put it away. I don't want to see it. All the dollars are still up in the air. "I've got news for you. There is only one way you got that dollar, you pleased another human being enough to give it to you. I don't know if it was your boss, I don't know if it was a customer, I don't know if it was a client, I don't know if it was a relative, but somebody voluntarily put it in your hand because of something you did for them. How can God not smile at that?"

And money is a very important thing. It is important to recognize that money is spiritual, not physical. People get shocked by that sometimes. But as long as you think money is physical, then you want to sort of clutch onto it, which is exactly the wrong strategy, because you can't invest if you're holding onto it. You can't take business risks if you're holding onto it.

You've got to recognize that it is like a tune. You can't hold onto a tune. You share a tune, you make a more musical world. Money is not like a saxophone, it is not like a violin, it is like a song, it is like a tune. You've got to recognize that it is not little disks of metal in your pocket or strips of colored paper in your wallet or a brown magnetic strip on the back of your credit card. That's not what money is, those are just symbols of money.

But money is a spiritual measure of what you have done for other human beings. And when you recognize that, you feel much more comfortable about telling your worth. I notice how embarrassed people sometimes are when they do something for you and you say, "How much do I owe you? Just tell me! I'm happy!"

James: We've actually -- we've made money an object of scorn. We understand filthy lucre. We understand that people can literally be consumed by it to the point that they can't even see. They're blinded by what they have. But the money is not the problem. There is something going on in the heart.

But the real inappropriate attitude toward money, which the Rabbi is pointing out, this attitude is though money in itself is terrible or prosperity. I'm telling you, if Jesus said to us -- and by the way, he had strong words for the person who buried their money and hid it and didn't use the talent to invest and reproduce and multiply. He talked about that. But he said the greatest on earth, this is our savior, Jesus, he said, "The greatest on earth is servant." You're saying as a rabbi, from your perspective, looking at it biblically, looking at the Old Testament, looking at the blessings of God on the Jewish people when they walked in accordance with those commands, the problems when we don't, but you said "servanthood, service, providing a service."

Rabbi Lapin: Focus on taking care of other people and remember, money didn't come into being while God's attention was distracted and all of the sudden he looked back and said, "Oh, what have they done? Money! Oh!" No! No! Money is God's plan for human economic interaction.

In the studio:

James: You know I really do enjoy listening to the people that have blessed us when we talk and bless our viewers. And they have a track record everywhere they go of impacting lives in such a way that at many times it totally transforms the people who listen or observe or become a part of what they're doing or what they're sharing and they receive it. We really feel like we've been called to not only be a blessing but to share blessings and to share people who are blessed. And we do it for the purpose of blessing the viewer so that you in turn bless others.

This is not inconsistent with the very creative purpose of God who when he created Adam and Eve said, "Be fruitful and multiply" And that fruitfulness meant more than having children because he said, "You're going to oversee everything I put under your watch care. You're going to be the stewards of everything I've entrusted to your oversight and I'm going to give you divine direction. And I'm going to enable you not only to experience the blessings of my divine guidance, my wisdom, my counsel -- don't set it aside, receive it. When you receive it and you're blessed, you're going to be a blessing to others."

He said, "I want you to be a nation of people so blessed, a family of people so blessed that you bless the families and the nations of the world." And the nations whose God is the Lord, who bless the Lord, and who are blessed by God, they bless others -- plain and simple! It's just the facts.

So no matter how great the challenges and I've referenced Psalm 112, you might just go there and read it because God says He will bless the generous; bless those that are compassionate. Well, as we listen to the prayer requests of people like you and other viewers, sometimes for family members or friends or neighbors, sometimes yourself say, "We feel challenges right now."

Well, we put together the series, *MORE than ENOUGH* because God says, "When you allow me to direct I'm not only going to meet your need --" Remember Paul said to the Philippians, "My God, the God I know personally will meet all of your needs -- all of them... according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." He's going to take care of you. But Paul also said we're blessed to bless... to be generous.

I want you to see the insights and direction that God has led us literally to share with you from some of our guests who talked about specific areas of concern. And we put all the teachings together in *MORE than ENOUGH*. All the different teachers on the CD's and in the CD package it comes in is the book I wrote some time ago, *True*

prosperity. Prosperity is oftentimes only defined as monetary, material wealth and gain. It's so much more than that. It doesn't limit that. As a matter of fact, it enhances that. But it's more than that. It's living with what money cannot buy or provide. And this will be sent to all of you who just simply say, "James, we want to be blessed. We want god's direction. But at the same time, we understand being blessed is being a blessing."

Here's what we're asking you to do right now. Translator: There are different levels of malnourishment I see in the children here. Twenty percent are malnourished. Ten percent are severely malnourished. Children under the age of five have a weaker immune system so when they suffer with malnutrition it increases the chances of them dying.
