Chonda: Very carefully.

James: Now you are maybe going to do some movies in Hollywood and some parts and so forth. By the way, I just want to go ahead and address that since you'll get letters on it.

Chonda: I know. My mother writes me every day.

James: I want you to take the brightest light into the darkest places on planet earth and that's one of them. The darker the situation, if you want to show off a diamond, go to the jeweler, he is going to put a dark cloth out on the table and put the diamond on it and put light on it. So you get the greatest jewels in the brightest light in the darkest situation and it looks the best. I want you to go and pierce the darkness.

So you've got our encouragement and our prayers and I believe you'll be a blessing. You're funnier than anybody in Hollywood.

Don't you think she is funnier than anybody Hollywood's got?

You go out there and just be a bright light for Jesus.

How do we pray for you? What can we do for you because we love you?

Chonda: Probably just that. For the first -- I've been a standup comedian for almost 20 years. I'm blessed to have climbed to the pinnacle of this market or whatever I've done. And I will continue to do this until Jesus comes.

I still work 98.9% of the time in the church world and the Christian conference world and love it. Those are my people. That's the world I know. The Lord is opening doors in places I'd never dreamed or imagined and I go in carefully and fearfully. And at the same time I'm getting such an education in what happened.

When Hollywood came along, the sitcom came to life because of war. When the Vietnam war hit and World War II that's when they came up with the sitcom ideas; it is just a historical fact. So the laughter and Hollywood and the fun of the storytelling in the movies, it was all a wonderful release and relief for difficult times that we're in.

Now it almost feels like the table has flipped and that's causing some of the difficult times that we're in. The influence that's going on in Hollywood is now perpetrating some of the difficulties that our teenagers are facing, and unwed pregnancies, and all that's going on. So that's very sad to me.

And at the same time, when I was in college and heading off to college to tell my mother that I wanted to major in theater arts, well, you might as well have told her I was just going to sell marijuana for the rest of my life.

[Laughter]

It was that forward and that fearful to that generation, and it shouldn't be.

James: The Kingdom of God should make the weight of God's presence felt as a footprint of God's presence on every part of life -- all the culture, everything.

Chonda: I said this in concert the other night. It was just on my heart. When you look at how horrible Hollywood is and some of the movies that they're putting out and the soap operas and all that mess that we --

James: It is -- that's what it is!

Chonda: It is just a mess; we have really no one to blame for that, so to speak, other than Satan, but ourselves because we pulled ourselves out.

So now to go back in or as a Christian to walk into some areas, and I've been in a couple of movies this year that weren't necessarily billed as faith-based movies but because I am a Christian, I read a script and said, "Okay, yeah, I can do this one. I can be in this one."

And they're good folks, I've met wonderful people. I've met really great Christians in Hollywood.

What's really sad is when you're on a movie set and you're having a little bite to eat or in-between scenes and somebody whispers, "By the way, I'm a Christian too." It is for the first time we're getting a very small taste --

James: I believe that's going to change. That's going to change.

You know Soul Surfer is a faith-based film but the beautiful girl that lost her arm to the shark that's the star of that and it is a very inspirational movie, she actually, after she lost the arm, gave water wells and showed on the show here and her dad was here with us telling how God had put that on her heart.

And we're doing water wells now and you know how much you enjoy what we're doing. I want to just say again that I really believe now, whether it is education and we really, the church gave education and academics over to some other force other than the literal

impression and principles of almighty God that are as rock solid as the foundation upon which we build the house safely and securely.

And it is not, by the way, preaching the word or hearing the word it is doing the word -- doing what he said. Not just discussing it and talking about it, but being a living demonstration of it which means that you not only affect academics and education, you affect the arts, you affect every part of society. You address the social ills and you address the economics. We're supposed to literally have dominion -- not take dominion, not be a theocracy -- but the weight of God affecting everything on planet earth.

I'm going to be praying for Chonda as she goes and does what God impressed her to do in the dark places of the world. Would you assure Chonda that she's got your prayers and that you appreciate her?

Chonda: Thank you so much! That means so much!

James: There is her web site again. Go there; you can get the DVD. We'll just simply tell you this, I would love to send you the CD. This really contains a lot of the best of Chonda Pierce. In the studio:

James: That little baby died. That picture -- she still has one baby that can crumple up the picture. And mother doesn't want that baby to die and we can stop it.

I'm telling you, we can put at the missionaries' request and their great love, God's love through them, we can put a water well there.

Betty and I get pictures like this all of the time. This is from St. Jude's. And we get the pictures of little children like this because Betty and I started helping St. Jude's and we try to help them a lot. But we get pictures like this from a child that is fighting a disease that they don't have a cure for, and oftentimes they say, "Will you help us find a cure, please?"

And then sometimes we get a picture of a beautiful little child that died and the mother says, "My little girl -- my little boy died. We think we're close to finding the cure for somebody else's." And boy, Betty and I help.

When I look at that little child and think of that little baby that died, I know the cure. Betty, we don't have to do research, we don't have to find some miracle drug, all we have to do is give them a fresh water well and we know the water is there. People like you provided the drilling rigs. Now we're asking you to help pay the cost. And the average cost, we're drilling 400 in 15 countries. And those 400 wells, the average cost - - and there are some places that are more expensive and there are some places where

the water is very shallow, maybe 150 feet but the average is \$4800. That could change in the coming months but currently it is there.

Would you drill a well? Would you go to the phone wherever it is right now.
