Betty: Welcome to *LIFE Today*. Thank you so much for joining us. I'm Betty, and this is James.

James: Well, we are very actively involved in doing what we believe is on God's heart but also we're convinced it's on your heart, and that's rescuing people from one of the most horrible prisons on this planet, and that's being trapped in the sex trafficking. It's hard to imagine that people would come and take a child, literally, into bondage and captivity but it's happened.

Giselle Meza is here and she is a former fashion model. She is basically, so to speak, in so many ways left the comfort of that particular life to go in and relieve people who have been trapped. We are working with her to build a *LIFE* Center, to rescue people that are really the primary targets for the predators.

You're going to be excited about what love does but you're going to find out something from Giselle that we didn't even know, how she was trafficked, not overseas but right here.

Would you welcome Giselle Meza to *LIFE Today*?

Giselle, glad to see you.

[Applause]

We're excited about building the *LIFE* Center. We know children are going to be rescued. We're excited about what you've done to give the women that have come out of the trade where they've been prisoners, and you've got them making beautiful necklaces. You've had them doing other things to learn a craft, to make a living. Our viewers are excited about that. As a matter of fact, these necklaces are available -- we will send one to those of you who say, "Let me help rescue one of the children or one of women." We're thrilled to be able to work with you.

One of the things that we were not aware of, and we've worked with you for quite some time and now we're actually really doing something you might say is quite a step of faith

and that is to build a *LIFE* Center, literally a home in a place where really there is no end to the ability to express love and to give them a family setting where they can grow. And we're excited about it.

But we didn't know that you had actually experienced the pain, the horror, the prison that you are now motivated with the compassion of the Lord to literally rescue people from, you were actually trapped.

Giselle: Yes.

James: What happened?

Giselle: Well, I was 14 years old. I'm originally from Costa Rica; I was raised in Costa Rica and I had moved to the United States. At 14 years old, I was left alone because my mother had to work three different jobs to be able to provide. My older sisters had already grown and gone away so I was alone at home. She had to leave me alone a lot at night. And actually, I took three buses to get to high school; it was the beginning of my high school.

As I would take the bus every day a woman started to come around and just gain my trust. She took me for lunch; then she invited me for dinner. I went. And suddenly I thought, wow, this is such a nice lady. She really cares about me. She is like that older sister that I didn't have around.

Then the summertime came around and she said, "I have a place in New York City. Why don't you come to New York with me and there I don't have anybody. I don't have family there. Come with me." So I thought, okay. In my heart, I thought, nobody really cares about me anyway. Who's going to miss me? Maybe I'm going to make a life for myself somehow. So I went with her to New York.

After a few days of being there she took me to get identification and that's where things started to change a little bit. She went and got me a fake I.D. So I thought maybe it's just because -- I'm thinking in my child mind -- maybe this is because she needs to take me to restaurants and maybe she needs something to get me in. So that continued.

Then she said to me after a few days, "You know, I have a place in London. Why don't you come with me to London?" I went with her to London. She took me to my room. This is your room and the room was cozy, things I had never had or seen. I thought, I'm in a dream. I get to stay here with this woman that cares for me? She is going to show me around.

So I stayed in this room and then she said, "Just rest." So I went to sleep. I woke up with such jet lag and really thirsty so I wanted to get some water. I look up out of my room and I walk down the hall to go into the kitchen. When I looked in the kitchen, it was full of Middle Eastern men. They were all sitting on the floor eating, having a party -- eating, smoking, drinking. There was music and everything. And I looked and I thought, where am I? And where is the woman that brought me here? Where am I?

So I looked in there and all I wanted was some water. Then I quickly got out. I walked down the hallway and every room that I started to look in was like an orgy going on. Basically, it was things I had never seen and I looked in one room and it was this giant salon full of men smoking and drinking. There were naked women running all over the place. They were playing tambourines. Every corner that I looked in was a different scenario going on. And I thought to myself, now what do I do?

I walked back down the hallway. I got into my room and I stayed there and I just went to sleep. The next morning I saw her and she said, "Oh, it was just a party that was going on and everything." But when I woke up everything was clean and there was nobody there.

So she gave me something to wear. She said, "Here, you need to wear this tonight." And then I said, "Okay, where are we going?" I was wondering when we're going to go home. She said, "No, we need to stay here for some more time. I need to take you with me to this restaurant; you need to dress nice."

So I put on what she gave me and we went and it was a very exclusive club. And I got there and once again, the place was full of Middle Eastern men and it was tables of them. So then I found myself basically having to go sit with these men.

And that night then, she realized she was calling me out because these were men that were waiting for me. So she had brought me there as a 14-year-old virgin that basically, she sold to all these men. So all I could do was do what she was forcing me to do. There was no way for me to escape or get out of there.

Basically, for me that's the night that the horror began. There was no way for me to escape there. There was no way for me to get out. There was nobody hearing me. Nobody knew I was even there. I'm stuck in this room with men after men after men and these are adult grown men that anywhere from their 20s to their 60s. So they knew very well what they were doing and it was very organized.

So I was trapped there and I would say that was 13 days of complete horror that you know I almost really wished I would have died... during that time. I thought, if I never get out of here -- in my mind I was thinking, how do I call my mom? How can I get out of here? How can I reach my mom?

And to think -- I thought as a child, somehow something great was going to come out of this. Somehow I was going to help my mom. Somehow I was going to become a princess or something. In my mind I'm thinking all sorts of fantasy things to be able to help because I was in such a bad situation as a child and my mom was struggling so hard.

I remember sitting in the bathroom and sitting in the bathtub thinking, who is going to help me? Nobody is going to pull me out of here. That just continued and continued and continued for about 13 days straight.

Then the same woman took me to one club one night and there was a man that said to me, "Okay." So he called me over to his table and -- I'll never forget his motioning of -- I almost knew that was the end of me, somehow. And he, motioned me to come over and I sat next to him. He said, "Okay, tomorrow morning I'll have my driver pick you up and then I'll take you to my country. We're leaving."

I didn't have a choice. I didn't have a choice to say. I had no voice. I couldn't say to him, "No, I don't want to go. I want to go to my mom. Call my mother."

Betty: Did your mom even know what had happened to you? You just disappeared?

Giselle: I just disappeared. She didn't know where I was. So I had told her I was going with some friends away.

So in this setting, at this club where this man said, "You're going to go with me," I thought, no, I don't want to go. I want to go home. And I realized that the woman that had trafficked me, that had sold me to all these men became very aggravated that that was the man that decided that wanted to take me. So there was something going on. She got very preoccupied with it and sat next to him and started drinking and talking to this man.

At that time I thought, I started to step away from the table and by this time, nobody had given me any food, nothing to drink, nothing to eat. She didn't care about me anymore. She didn't love me like I thought she was. She wasn't even giving me water. Here I was being forced to service these adult men completely against my will, not even knowing what was going on.

So I stepped away and I went to the bathroom. When I came back, I heard a voice that said, "Get out now. Go!" And so I thought, how am I going to get out of here? And they were all preoccupied drinking and everything. So I walked downstairs and there was a driver and I said, "I left and nobody saw me. I need to go back to the flat." And the man actually took me. He took me back.

I ran upstairs. They had maids in there that were cleaning and I grabbed my backpack and I ran to the airport. He took me to the airport. I had no way to get home. So I called collect my friends in Oregon, and they asked their mother to get me a ticket to go back home. I was able to get back.

James: Basically, you escaped.

Giselle: Escaping -- and to this day, had I not heard the voice that said, "Get out now." ...And if that man didn't drive me, which I don't know why he took me to the airport. If he hadn't taken me, I would have never escaped; I never would have gotten away. I would have been trapped. I would have been lost forever into a different country.

James: You would have been trapped in the very situation that you're trying to help girls get free from. And you're helping children and girls who are even in greater poverty. They have greater distress than you had, they're more vulnerable. And it's real easy not only to make the children or the girls think there is something better but even their families, oftentimes are misled.

So you have -- and this is the thing that's so incredible right now, Giselle, who experienced this pain -- now most of you who watch *LIFE Today* and you listen to me, you know that I didn't have a father. I grew up very poor, and obviously out of that pain and that loss I care about the Fatherless, I care about people who have fathers and families get to know the Father, the ultimate Father because I know that's what we all need -- every father needs that, every child needs it, and the poor, the downtrodden all over the world because I identify and I know we can move beyond that, there is hope.

Well, Giselle was trapped. So she understands the pain and she understands the effective manipulation that takes place and how vulnerable the children are. So Giselle, you have gone to the mission field and you've gone to one of the beautiful settings in the sense that the beautiful mountains and Everest is there, as the great beauty, and yet the sorrow and the poverty makes these children so vulnerable, and women so vulnerable, that they're easily taken captive and then taken into the sex trafficking in India in the areas where they have plenty of opportunity to be sold and you're committed to rescuing them.

I know right now because of our communication and our mission team being with you on the field, you're more excited than you've ever been because now you have a place to help the very children that are headed for what you experienced and women that are already in it. You believe this is an answer to your prayers in behalf of the desperate in Nepal.

Giselle: Yes. Amen. I was able to get away and to be able to be part of helping to rescue them, of providing hope for them, of intervening for traffickers taking these children and these women that will be lost forever and never found again, is so joyful, to be able to be part of this.

I could never do it. Our teams could never do this. If it wasn't for your help, if it wasn't for the help of the viewers, and *LIFE Today* partnering with us, we wouldn't be able to be out there doing the job that we're doing.

Right now at the border between Nepal and India, we're able to stop between three to seven little children from being trafficked every week. We're able to go up --

James: Did you hear that? Rescue three to seven every week with what they have now. And of course, when you get the center, you've got an immediate place to take them where they're not just trying to make do but they've got a place that's like a haven of security. And then that's going to expand your ability, isn't it, especially when people see what's happening.

It's like when Jesus is lifted up, he draws people. That's precisely what you're going to see.

Giselle: Yes, it's incredible that we've been able to, with your support, go out and rescue these children. But now we don't have anywhere to put them so we've been taking these children and we've been putting them in volunteers' homes and pastors' homes.

We've got right now 15 little children that we know that once we're able to get this rescue center and this *LIFE* Center that we've been praying about, that we can only do with your help and your support, we'll be able to move those children into these homes and they'll have a new life and they'll be safe.

I know those children have no help. They have no way out. They have no way to have a new life. But because of your help, we're now able to provide a home for them so they can now be safe. I was -- I was rescued by Jesus. I was able to go back home.

James: But there were still some people involved. There were some people involved even

though they may not have known it, our viewers can know it. They see what's happening. So they know they're an agent of help and rescue. But you still had to have help and now we're offering help that's very real, it's what our viewers do.

Would you here say thanks to Giselle and to God for what the Lord's enabling her to do?

[Applause]

Giselle, I really on behalf of the children and the women that you're actually now after they get out and get free, you're giving them jobs and these precious children -- see, they're the targets of the predators.

I want you to just go with us to Nepal and with our mission team and just listen to the heart of the mission workers. And Giselle is there reaching out. Watch this.

On the mission field:

>> The traffickers are around here and go through these kinds of precious girls' houses. They are being trafficked every day for a little amount. They are tricked out of the villages and sold into the brothels overnight.

Giselle: These are three sisters and they are an example of what happens up here in these mountain regions. Their mother had passed away. They were alone and an uncle took them and so a trafficker came through, offered some money posing as a businessman to take these little girls into India and to give them a job as maids over there. The uncle needed this money so he was just about to sell these little girls and right in time there was a volunteer from the prevention program that approached the uncle and they came to watch this movie.

>> We go around the schools here. We take our movie there also and many children that are at risk come to our prevention movie and see it, and be aware of what is going on, and kids like these have been prevented through the movie. The movie is about the girl at the age of 13 years old; how she gets tricked by the trafficker, promised a better future and takes her across the border and sells in few hundred dollars to the brothel and the guy walks away.

Giselle: This has helped to save these little girls, but now we've taken these beautiful precious little girls but we have no space to keep them. And we're in tremendous need of

being able to provide a *LIFE* Center so that we can help these little girls to thrive and to be safe.

James: Boy, you're just seeing clear images there of just evil personified; that you would take those beautiful little girls, precious little innocent ones and use them to gratify the most selfish despicable appetites imposed on vulnerable children. And then to see the wisdom of the mission workers, and Giselle and the others that they would show the children how vulnerable they are with this film, to just show what's actually happened, and what can happen. And then to realize that we can give them a future and a hope. That's why we're calling it Rescue Life and give them hope and a future.

Listen, I know, Betty, there is not a viewer watching during this last week of Rescue Life where we're asking you to help us rescue as many children as we can in many different areas; we work in Thailand, we work in Cambodia, we work in some areas where we don't say the name where we're working because jeopardize the mission workers.

But we're also asking you to help us there in India but with the *LIFE* Center in Nepal, and we can build that because the children are taken out of the poverty there and then taken into India and used as sex slaves. So what we're asking you to do, and Betty, I'm believing everyone watching is going to help today. Here's what I want you to understand, \$128 will rescue someone from the trafficking and it's going to be doubled because someone with a broken heart and compassion and the ability says, "I'll match your gift."

Then we're asking you to help build this center, the *LIFE* Center there in Nepal. It's so important we do this. They need a place, they need a home, they need a *LIFE* Center; and not only the ones that stay there but so many that will come through there; so many that will be exposed, for instance, to the message of the film.

We're asking you right now please, I don't really think that I need to plead with you to do it; I think your heart leaps at the opportunity knowing that whatever you do will be doubled. Would you go to the phone right now? Would you take your bankcard and use it like a check? If you write a check make it to *LIFE* but it's real important you call us and tell us what's coming so we can -- I would love to be able to report to the mission workers there, "Look, add another wing. We got that kind of response."

And yes, we will do that. We get money to drill more wells, we'll drill more than the goal, but you're the ones that determine that. So each child you can help us rescue, each gift you make, we're asking for \$1,000 gifts or more to help build that *LIFE* Center, and for as many \$128 gifts as we can get. Betty, I'm believing everyone is going to help.

Betty: I notice as we were watching, I heard a little giggle from one of the girls and I thought, how sweet, how precious. That's what it is supposed to be like: Joy, safety, and security. That's what we need the *LIFE* Center for. A place where they can lay their heads and not be afraid at night or in the morning when they wake up that someone is going to take them away. Please help us do this.

James: One of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit is joy. And Paul said, "joy unspeakable and full of glory." And Jesus said, "Of such is the kingdom of heaven... little children." Would you enable them to be little children and like Betty said, to smile?
