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Week 12

Betty: Welcome to *LIFE Today*. Thank you so much for joining us. I'm Betty and this is James.

James: And we're thrilled to have Lisa Bevere with us. I'll tell you this and we love the guests we have on. You can't imagine we'd invite someone we just don't like. I thought about it; I thought we would have some pretty good conversations. But Lisa and John are two of our favorite people. They're awesome guests. They communicate all over the world the truth of God's life and love, and they do it so effectively.

Now Lisa has a new book. She's real good at saying things to girls, and to women that they really need to hear. She did *Purity's Power* here. Awesome! I just wish the whole world would hear it. *Girls with Swords: How to carry your cross like a hero*. I'm anxious to hear about it.

I want to know what's going on with Lisa. Would you welcome Lisa Bevere back to *LIFE Today*?

Lisa, how are you?

Lisa: Thank you, James and Betty!

James: Glad to see you. What have you been doing?

Lisa: Well, I just came from a Women of Faith retreat. We're really excited about what God is getting ready to do. We believe God is really putting some swords in girls' hands and the women are rising up, and there is just an incredible destiny on their lives, and seeing what has been such a beautiful legacy just moving into the next step and we're super excited about being a part of that.

James: And you are going to be doing the conferences, some of them, in this year, 13, you'll be doing 14 next year in the year 14.

Lisa: Yes, unless they fire me after this year.

James: You may be on trial. Now tell me about the book.

Lisa: Well, James, I really had such an awareness that there is a whole generation of young girls that are under attack and they know about the truth but they don't have the truth in their hands. I became aware where so many times... I would know from the word, they would know about the word but it had been interpreted to them, never declared to them. It was kind of just filtered through life experiences. And I just became aware that they were unarmed. We're in a day and age where there really is no neutral ground.

Christianity, I love what was quoted at the beginning of the book is "It is a battle, it is not a dream." And we fight to enter into God's dream for each of us, and we fight to enter into his dream of heaven. We've always been part of his dream. He loves us. He chose us but we're very much a part of an epic battle.

I saw these girls and they're just not aware. And everything about what is going on in our culture is stripping them. It is either distracting them, diminishing them, dividing them, or seeking to destroy them.

God said, "You need to re-forged a sword. You need to have some things that they can put in their hands that when the enemy comes after them, they are not found with empty hands but they have actually something they can handle, something they can grip." I really believe that God wants ultimately, his Word to be in our mouth, to pass through our heart so that we become a weapon in his hands and we don't fight to hurt, we fight for love.

As I was writing this book I became so aware that the cross is a sword with the point in the ground. It is how God ended the hostility between God and man; and it is a reconciliation, and we have been armed with the love of God to restore other people. So one of the swords -- actually, you kind of helped me out with -- one of the swords in this book is about forgiveness and restoration, which would be a sword laid down.

You know the very first time I met you guys, you asked me about who I was, which I have to be honest with you, meant the world to me because nobody had ever asked me who I was. I was just a makeup artist. I think I said, "I'm just a makeup artist." You said, "No, no, who are you?" And for some reason, I told you that I was a daughter of an alcoholic. I told you that I was a youth pastor's wife. I told you that we were in a season of incredible vulnerable transition.

And you looked at me and you said, "Do you know my father was an alcoholic?" I told you my dad's name was Joe, and you told me your father's name was Joe. And you would have no idea what that did for me. Because, James, when I was 21 years of age and I got saved, for some reason -- I know the 80s were awkward for a lot of ministry things but I was sitting in a service and somebody said, "If your life isn't compelling enough to get your entire family saved, you have no right ministering." And I remember thinking I have got to get my dad saved! This man is going to stop me from the call of God on my life!

And so instead of reaching out in love, I dragged my dad here to Dallas, Texas. We were living in an apartment. I took him to church service. I sat there the whole time. I had all the intercessors around him, looking at him, praying for him. I told the pastor, you look him in the eyes when you ask somebody, "Where are you going tonight?" And my dad just looked back at the guy when everybody else had their head bowed and was like, "I'm going to hell and you can go there too." He did not care. He didn't have any fear of God whatsoever.

And of course, then the pastor said something like, "If you feel like that person just needs your help, you can take their hands and bring them down." Well, I reached out to my dad, tears streaming down my face, "Dad, you're going to hell! Come on down!" And I grabbed a hold of his hand and he just popped up, let loose a whole string of

cuss words because actually, I think it was hard for my dad to even form sentences without cuss words. And so he just stormed out of the building. I was so discouraged. I thought, I've failed. I've failed. I had everybody in place and I failed. But you already know that John and I are a little bit relentless.

And so I let him go back to Florida. Called some of the churches and I suck the people -- I'm like, "I need you guys to go after my dad! You need to call him." They're calling him, "Your daughter is concerned you're going to hell. Can we pray for you? Can we do something?"

And my dad would call me and say, "Get your dogs off of me. You've sic'ed your dogs on me. Get them off of me."

I would be like, "Dad, you just need to get saved!"

[Laughter]

Then I decided to fast and pray until he got saved. And thank God, he released me of that because I would have died. I would have completely died. But I took a weekend, John and I didn't have children. I had my Bible. I prayed. The first night was easy. But there is only so much you can like pray for like... I prayed every verse I could think of. I prayed lying down. I fell asleep so I stood up. I walked around. I did everything possible and I was really almost at the place of getting myself sick staring at the phone, praying that God would hit my dad with lightning but not kill him, just wake him up to his real condition -- just bad dreams or something.

I heard in the midst of all my nonsense and my striving. I heard God say, "I love your father more than you love your father." Which I have to be honest with you was kind of a revelation because I barely liked my dad. I was just trying to get the man saved, which is a horrible motivation.

But he said, "Give him to me. You say you believe my word. You don't believe my word. My word says you and your household will be saved." He said, "Stop being weird, and honor your father."

And I said, "Okay."

So I remember I opened up my Bible that day and I wrote my dad's name by Acts 16 and I said, "Heavenly Father, I gave you my natural father." And from that point forward, I wasn't weird on purpose, I might have been weird by accident and I would go to visit him and I always talked to him as though we were part of the family of God. I shared things with him, and of course, he looked at me like, okay. So he called me "Miss In-the-name-of-Jesus."

But anyway, I would talk to him. I would bring my kids for him to see. But my dad went from bad to terrible, and it was no longer safe to visit him.

I remember there came this time where I started to feel like I need to see him. He was in an alcohol related dementia center. Half the time, I couldn't talk to him. He actually could barely talk any longer. One of my sons, my oldest son said, "Mom, I want to go with you when you go see grandfather." He said, "I think he is going to look at me and get saved."

And I was like, "Okay, you're coming with me. If you've got that kind of faith for my dad, you come." And also, Addison had just had my father's great grandchild. So we brought Asher. And I brought my beautiful daughter-in-law Julianna, and we all show up. And we show up; my dad looks at us and he's kind of like I think I know these people but I'm not sure who you are.

And so we kind of worked with him. I had pictures all spread out. I was showing him pictures of him and Addison. All the sudden he holds up the picture and he points to Addison and I said, "Yeah, that's right. I'm your daughter. This is your grandson. This is your great grandson."

I remember thinking, he is here right now. What do I say to this man who is headed straight for hell? I don't know what to say to him.

This is what I heard the Holy Spirit say, "Tell him he was a good dad."

I thought that's a lie! You do not lie to people on the verge of death with dementia and tell them they were a good dad.

And I heard, "He was as good as he knew how to be, Lisa. Tell him he was a good dad."

So I picked up my father's hands and I put them in-between me and him. And I said, "Dad, you were a good dad."

And I'm telling you, it was like an electrical current went through his body. That Sicilian man that used to put me up on the wall and hold me at eye level began to shake and cry. And he began to kiss the back of my hands, tears streaming over my hands. And he said... the only two words he said the entire time I was there. He said, "Thank you."

Time goes past. I have such a sense that my father -- I feel like he's going to die. When I talked to my mom about it, she said, "Lisa, that man will outlive all of us out of spite. What are you thinking? He is not going to die."

I said, "I just have this feeling, he is going to die."

She said, "Absolutely not."

Well, five days later, I'm in Canada and I wake up in the middle of the night and I just feel like something is not right. Something is not right. I pray, I listen to music, I try to read. I just can't shake it. I turn on my phone, there's nothing. I go and do some television shows at Huntley. I can't wait to turn on my phone. I turn on my phone. I'm

driving to the airport. I see one of my sons has called. I call him back. I'm like, "Arden, are you okay?" It is my baby.

He's like, "Mom, I can't find my retainer. Dad lost my retainer at the hotel. I can't find..."

I'm like okay, wait. That's not the problem.

Then I call the next place. "Your son has lost his retainer twice. Now you're going to have to pay for it."

I'm like why? I'm in Canada. The last number I didn't call though because I didn't recognize it. I get through customs and immigrations and I dialed the number and I hear, "As you know, your father is dying."

I was like, "What? I don't --." I just dial it back. I didn't play the rest of the message. I don't get a name. I'm like, "No! I didn't know. I didn't know my dad's dying."

They said, "We started the morphine drip last night."

At the time where I woke up, they had started the morphine drip. They said, "If you want to see him, you need to come right now."

I said, "I can't get to Orlando. I can't drive yet. So I'm going back to Denver and then navigate it."

And they said, "Well, I'm heading to the hospice right now." So she gets there before the plane took off. She put the phone up to my dad's ear. And I said, "Thank you, for taking me fishing. I love you, dad. I remember that you taught me how to dive." -- Things from my childhood. I said, "If you can't hold your breath any longer, you can go. But I'm coming tomorrow if you can wait."

Drove home from the airport. When I landed and gathered my boys, and I was just telling them I was going to have to leave the next day and I get the phone call that he was gone.

Here's what happened. January of 2011, February of 2011, March and April of 2011, I traveled and I preached the faithfulness of God. God you are faithful. I don't... I just trust and I grab a hold of your faithfulness.

In May, I met the faithfulness of God. I was speaking at a conference and I kept noticing this one really cute little red-headed girl. And I thought, "Wow, that's a cute haircut." And then I was at a break out session, there she was again. I'm like there's the cute red head! I go to my hotel that night, getting ready to come out to speak. She is in the lobby.

I walk over to her and I said, "Hi! I've just noticed you out of 1500 people, I just keep noticing you. Can I... I'm Lisa."

She said, "Oh no, I'm April. We spoke on the phone."

I said, "No. I don't know anybody in Jacksonville, Florida."

She said, "Well, I'm not from Jacksonville." She said, "I drove five hours to come and tell you about your father." She said, "I have been your dad's social worker for the last five years." She said, "Do you know he was an awful patient?"

I said, "Yeah, I think I'd heard that."

She said, "He stole a car."

I said, "Yeah, I heard that one."

And she said, "He beat up another patient. He ran away. He was kicked out of his last facility." She said, "But for the last year, he was an angel."

I looked at her and I said, "Wait, wait. What do you mean?"

She said, "Yeah. For the last year every time I saw him, he would take the back of my hands and he would kiss them."

And that was when I knew, James and Betty, that when I told my dad he was a good dad, he heard, "You're forgiven. Your guilt is cancelled. Heaven is open to you." And that battle that I had hoped I would win on this side, I'm going to get to know my dad in eternity.

James: Oh, boy. I feel like I just need to turn to you and say God wants you to hear that.

And you said something earlier, Lisa that just took me back because when you said that you couldn't go to your dad but God said you can always come to me. You go to me because you didn't have him. And that's always been true with me. And God said to me, I knew you'd come. He always knew I would come to him because I knew I needed him. I'm going to be 70 this year and I still need him and he knows it. As much as I love the relationship I have with God, he loves the relationship he has with me -- and he does with you. And that's a miracle story.

And the God that forgave her dad, and the God that taught her on this journey, and the beauty in which she has grown in the grace of our Lord, it's for you, the forgiveness, the father/child relationship, daughter/son whatever. He wants it with you. You have it now right where you are. You are watching because you were supposed to.

So just ask him, "God, be my father. I want to know you. Forgive me, give me a clean slate. Make me new. Be my father. I receive your forgiveness, your son Jesus." You have a chance right now to lift people up out of the pit of despair and hopelessness. This isn't just wishful thinking. Because of the love of God and mission workers, and because of the connections God's given us with caring people, we can rescue the perishing -- together! But we have to do it together! We really need to move together as a family responding to the father. I want you to look in and see prisoners that can be set free.

On the mission field:

Announcer: This is a prison. Not a real prison run by a government and police officers but it is a prison nonetheless. Room after room contains not much more than a bed. Depraved visitors to these types of prisons pour millions of dollars into human trafficking worldwide. The prisoners are scared young girls held captive by violent slave traders but the prisoners that live here did nothing wrong. They have broken no laws. The girl in cell 4D is innocent.

In the studio:

James: Oh, boy! Let me just tell you, and since she cried out, God had a savior, she's given her life to Christ and she's out of that brothel, that pit of destruction where, as she said, she didn't have any control over her body.

My heart breaks to think that girls are trapped. It is not like these girls went out to have a trade that was inappropriate prostitution role in life -- they were captured... they're held captive. The people that come in there are held captive too. And only God can set them free -- only the grace of God.

What we do, Betty, as we go in... and the missionaries, the first thing we do is we rescue children before they get them -- the predators get them. Then we get the ones that are there and we work carefully to get them out. That's the case there. Then we rebuild.

Betty, it is an incredible outreach. You always say it is hard for you to talk about this. This is not some part of something you ever really knew anything about. But you can do everything about it, though.

Betty: Absolutely! And we want to. I heard her say, "There is no hope." God is her hope. And yes, these precious children need to know there is a God and we will save them. And he will use us to be a part of that connection to their lives so that they can get out of this lifestyle that they never asked for.

They don't want -- she said, "I don't want to do the things with my body that they're making me do. I feel like my heart is captured. My heart is not free." Let's join together and let's make a difference in these precious children's lives. Let's set them free. Let's set their hearts free and their lives.

James: Betty, it is important for our viewers to know that you are the reason that we talk to you about this.
