James: Y'all are looking good! I'm watching you. You look good... and you too! Oh, you're glad I can't see you, I bet. I welcome you to *LIFE Today*. I'm James Robison; my wife Betty and I are thrilled to have this opportunity to spend time with you, especially when we're sharing Beth Moore.

If you're not aware, normally, on Wednesdays you will see Beth. We call it "Wednesdays with Beth." She is a blessing. Now she is talking about don't forget to remember. Don't what? Don't forget to remember! The Bible is filled with literal commands to remember. Don't forget!

Well, let's see what Beth has to say about that from the Word of God because God has given her a keen understanding of the word and she seems to be able to communicate it where all of us can understand it. Would you welcome Beth Moore? Here she is.

Previously taped video clip:

Beth: There is nothing to make you remember like moving out of your home of 27 solid years. I told Keith that he would have to honestly bury my body in our backyard in that home because I was never going anywhere -- never leaving that home. I'd raised my children in that home and I was not ever going to leave that home. And then four months ago, I stood with Amanda and Anna Beth and Melissa, I'll tell you in a few minutes where Keith was at the time because God did the strangest thing by letting me have a time all by myself in that empty house, and then with my children in that empty house.

But I stood with all of those boxes and watched a moving van take off with our stuff, with our whole lives, 27 years of living was in a truck. The last thing I did, and I could bawl try to get this out of my mouth, I loved that home. I had so many memories; our whole lives are in that home. I'm just steeped into it. We just stood there and walked over to the shutters and just shut them. Totally empty. One right after another.

When I turned around to Melissa and went, "This is so sad... so sad." And we wanted to move but it was so sad. I've worn that floor out -- worn that floor out. I cannot tell you that floor is just laminated in my tears. I loved when my little tiny girls would -- I would have to hold Melissa and when she got to go up the stairs by herself I made her come down sitting down on her bottom. For years -- she practically did it when she was 11, "Sit on your bottom to go down the stairs."

I loved it so much. And Keith and I, he had to be out of town on the day we were moving. Y'all, I nearly had a panic attack and I've never had a panic attack. I nearly had a panic attack driving to the new place. We moved out in the country next to Keith's parents. The moving van was in front of us, I was right behind it. And I need to turn up the air conditioner on my car and get it straight on me. I went, "Oh! Oh! Oh, it's so painful." And I know you're thinking, "Woman, get a grip!" 27 years!

And what I love that the Lord did, it is like he gave us -- the things he caused us to find and our eyes to fall on were like he just manipulated every bit of it, and of course, he did. But Keith walks in to me and he says, "I found this in the attic." I want to hold it up where you can see it. I left the dust on it because I just think it shows you; I did not wipe it off at all. Do you know I barely remembered this box? Barely -- that's my handwriting from how many years -- that's like -- that's young handwriting that. Young!

You know we have no penmanship these days because we don't have to practice our penmanship. So my writing is awful now but in those days it was pretty cute, real bubbly. Really bubbly!

He said, "I've already --."

I said, "Oh, sit down with me and look!"

You know what he said? It just killed me. He goes, "Oh, I've already looked through it."

And I began looking through it, just a few to just take you on a little journey that is very quick. I also found the picture of Keith and I on our honeymoon. Because the truth of it is, this was the man -- dig that hair, girlfriend! I had me some late -- I was on my way to the 80s right there. This was the man that God called me to marry. Not the other. This ornery man right here that would keep me completely honest, this would be the man.

I also found a precious, precious picture of my two little girls at a wedding and I relived that whole experience. You see that little one? Whoo wee! Listen, she tried every single nerve I had but I loved them so much I could not even bear it.

I then found a letter that Michael, who had lived with us for seven years wrote me and wrote our family at the time. We called him, his nickname was Spud; we are a big nickname family and that's what we called him. You can see the date on it. This was the year he was gone from our family. We were just like -- it was such a tumultuous thing, I have no words for it. But "Dear family, I wish you were here with me. I miss y'all so much."

We even taught our children to say y'all. They wrote it. Look at all the different colors. It was like whoa! One reason I'd not wanted to leave that house was because I was afraid if we moved on, it was the only place I'd ever had him. If we moved on, we would somehow forget.

And all of this, I just thought the whole way --, I saw it in all manner of letter when I was going through times that were so painful in my life and so much bondage that I cried.

On the last day Keith spent cleaning out the attic, he sent me a picture on our cell phones and this is it. I want you to see, just on my back porch, trash... just trash. Praise

God the Lord let us leave that there. We did not put that in the moving van. Because of his great name and his grace, we got to leave all the trash from that house in that house. Now we'll have more trash in the new house and I feel sure we'll never move again. I only move every 27 years so I'm not going anywhere. I like the same house over and over. But you know what? We get to leave our trash behind.

Do you keep moving on but you just keep loading it up with you? It's also in the moving van. Stop it! You do get to leave the trash for the trash men to get. Don't forget to remember the whole way your Lord and your God has led you.

I want you to see verse 16 and then we're going to close with a brief two and three. Number two you'll find in verse 16: The one who fed you in the wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know, that he might humble you and test you, these are very important words, to do you good in the end. I want to ask you, don't forget to remember what a gift of God a good humbling can be -- what a gift of God a good humbling can be. Never underestimate the power of a fresh humbling because if you walk with God and you get a fresh humbling, something good is coming and he's got to get you ready for it.

So we've got to have, we've got to get rid of some of our pride, and some of our boastfulness, and some of our credit taking, and just some of our arrogance about all manner of things and let him do a fresh work in us but it can't be done when we've got a big proud heart. So listen, a good humbling; that is a thing that he always does to bring us good. Somebody look at one another and say, "Humbling does us good!"

Audience: Humbling does us good.

Beth: I'm not happy I just said that because no telling what's going to happen.

But it's always to do us good in the end and so we've got... and you've allowed me to walk through part of our family story with you. Don't forget to remember the whole way the Lord your God has led you. I pray that in my sharing mine I didn't just mean

for you to hear mine, I want you to have your own. Think back -- think back where your God has led you and brought you. The third one is this, do not forget to remember to flagrantly -- and I want you to write that word. I'm into "flagrantly" right now. I keep saying it about everything. Flagrantly -- to flagrantly bless the Lord your God every time you feel satisfied.

Bless the Lord your God. If we have more thankful hearts no telling! No telling! If we keep our humility and retain thankful hearts and never forget him, there is just no telling -- there's no telling what he would do. But our propensity is to do exactly the opposite. I base that on -- if you want to put a verse beside it and I'm glad you do, it would be verse 10 out of Deuteronomy eight: And you shall eat and be full and you shall bless the Lord your God for the good land he's given you. It's good, enjoy it and bless his name.

Flagrantly, every time you realize I've eaten and I'm satisfied. That was really fun. We had Christmas, it was such a fun time. Bless the Lord, oh, my soul and all that is within me, bless his holy name.

I've got just two last visuals for you and I pray they'll bless you. This is from last Thanksgiving. This is Anna Beth at Mother's Day out. I'm just wondering if you can handle that. Oh! Oh! Y'all... really? Honestly! Does it get better than that? Do you know that we are the children of God and that when we're thankful, we're just that dear to him? We don't have to be all this grown up with God. He's our father. He calls us children. We're his children. He still can baby us. He still also chastises us and says "grow up" but I just want you to know, when we look at her and we go, "That's the cutest thing I've ever seen."

Don't think that if that's what it moves us to say and we're committed in the image of God that there are not times when God looks at you, looks over at his son and says, "That right there is about the cutest thing we have ever seen!" I mean what a wonder!

So in this box I found one more thing. Well, I found a ton of things but I found one more thing that I wanted to show you: Welcome baby! See how old it is? Does it look -- it doesn't look 32, the age of my oldest daughter. It doesn't look 29, the age of my

youngest daughter. It doesn't look six, the age of Jackson. It doesn't look three, the age of Anna Beth. It should look about 54 years old. And it was to my mother from my Aunt Ada. We called her Aint Ada. I don't know what you... it is Auntie to some of us. It is aunt to some of you proper folks and it is aint to some of us. And it says, "We're so glad about Wanda Beth." (My name is Wanda Elizabeth but they called me Wanda Beth early on. Wanda was a very good friend of my mothers.) "How perfect for Gay..." (That's my older sister that I've told you some things about. She would have been three when I was born.) "And you'll be gladder as time goes on because they'll be so close and enjoy each other so."

I love that because if I had read this any sooner, it could have broken my heart. We went through such a time of separation and fright -- a fright show. It says, "I had a sister two years younger. Our best to you all. We'll write soon." This is the part I want you to hear.

"Frieda lost her's." That would have been -- and that means she lost her child, her pregnancy did not result in a birth but she lost a child and not early in the pregnancy but late enough. "Frieda lost hers in Florida on vacation," stay with me --. "Doctor said it was best." I'm quoting her. "It was not perfect." "Doctor said it was best --." See it right here -- can you testify? "It was not perfect."

And I thought, oh! I'll show you not perfect. Welcome baby, look at ain't perfect -- miss ain't perfect. What a mess! But my God has brought me -- don't forget to remember.

In the studio:

James: Wow! Whoo, Beth. I just give glory to God; not only for you but what God has done with impossible situations.

To all of you who are watching all over the world, and Betty, we watch such a disregard of life where people just kill as though -- they say they're going to take their own life, they're unhappy so they take several other people with them. In other words, they have such low regard for their own life, such a low regard for life itself -- such a low regard for life.

Now think about this a moment, once a nation, once a community, once a family of people begin to devalue life at any stage, any age, and especially helpless, innocent life, and what could be more helpless, more innocent than the unborn? When you devalue life at any stage or age, you begin to devalue all life. The preciousness of it has literally been lowered and can easily be discarded without flinching. You say, "Oh, it can't be that way." But wait a minute, 50 million -- 50 million -- far more than what happened in Nazi Germany have been terminated in the most vulnerable helpless place. God heal our thinking. Show us how precious life is that you would give your own son to redeem us because you value us so much; in Jesus' name.

On the mission field:

>> These are young girls that have been sold?

>> She has been sold; she is five years old. That is one --

>> Five years old?

>> Yes. She is now big. They put her in the cage. I think if you come to Cambodia a few years ago, you read the newspaper. They put hot water and a nail in her head.

>> Can I see those other girls please? And these girls were also trafficked? So how old is this girl?

>> Three years, she's been raped.

>> Three years old and had been raped. Oh, my gosh!

>> So my friend, because she didn't want to have sex with a client; she didn't want to have sex with the clients. And she had been killed in front of me --.

>> She was killed because she did not want to service.

>> Because it's not that she don't want -- because she can't. -- Because she was sick. Because she had been sold. Because she had like 20 client a day -- because she can't. Her body is now -- she cannot -- her body is dead. So they kill us.

In the studio:

James: God, I'm so sorry. I'm so sorry that sin has such a grip on anyone, any of us at any time.

God, deliver us from evil -- from the evil one. We are the hope. Yes, we are -- for those thousands. It took the wisdom of God and yielded missionaries to show us the way.

What they are able to do is go to the families where they have children in these terrible poverty-stricken areas where the predators come and tell the family, whether it is a single mother or a couple, that they will take their children, their little girl and oftentimes boys, into the city and train them and teach them and they will make good money, and they will have good future and they can bring it back to the family. And these precious people, ignorant people, but they love their children, they want something better than they had and they sell them or they just let them take them -- and then you see what happens.

Now the woman you were listening to, she was trafficked and she got saved and freed and now she is trying to rescue and teach others, and let you know what's happening - - telling us the truth as one who knows.

All those little girls standing there gripping that wire, would you rescue one of them? Here's what the mission workers have proven to us. It takes \$128, invested to be able to rescue a child. We ask people, is there any way you can help us rescue ten? Nearly 3,000 taken every day and the next day; would you help us rescue ten? That doesn't sound like many. That sounds like a lot -- just one person's child or two children and you help us. \$128, we can rescue one before they get them, get them out and take care of them and retrain them -- actually train them for a future, give them a craft, a job. That's what we do together.

When I say "we," it is you the viewers and our mission workers, with a touch and an anointing of God; the divine enabling of God and the compassion of God and his love is on those missionaries. But they are empty-handed; they are so limited unless we give them the wherewithal to fulfill the mission God has sent them on.

If you'll dial the number, which is there always as a prayer line for you. If you have a prayer need and even today when I'm talking about helping others, 80% of the calls will be people saying, "Pray for me, my heart is broken." And you believe we will because we love you. We're here for you. But if you can possibly dial the number and say, "I want to rescue a child, here's my gift. I want to rescue ten."

And we had a *LIFE* Center fire in the Ukraine that destroyed a great part of a building. We need to rebuild it and expand it because the need is so great; that's a \$275,000 additional challenge. Would you help us? I'm praying there will be people who will give an extra \$1,000 toward the building. Betty and I are doing that.

And we always -- always seek to rescue 10 or 20 or 30. We ask God and we've been asking him every time, "God, enable us to do it." And everybody steps up. Don't think that \$128 or even a part of that isn't important. It is!
