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Week 39: Christmas Shoes & Smiles

Mission show: Last Day

James: Betty and I welcome you to *LIFE Today*. I'm James Robison. It's an early time, I know for some of you to be thinking about Christmas but we're talking, Betty, about Christmas shoes and smiles. Now listen to me, I know for a fact, and of course, Betty and I have been married 50 years, 51 to be exact, okay, we've got some age on us, we've got some years, so we probably don't think about Christmas the way a child does anymore. But I think all of us realize how much children do love it.

Betty: I still love it pretty much!

James: You do, but it's still a little different from waiting for the gifts. So I want to say to all of you who might have some of those years on you or maybe you're a young adult or a young person, I would like you to put yourself over in the place of a child who gets very little if anything for Christmas.

It's probably shocking to some people, Betty, to realize that I lived in such impoverished conditions that for the Christmas when I was nine, our Christmas tree was a painting of a tree on a piece of paper that I'd painted and we hung it on the wall. I had put some little ornaments on it as a nine year old. There was a card table under that picture and no gifts. I didn't really think that I'd get any gifts.

I found out later my mother sent back some gifts that the pastor and his wife and an aunt had sent me because she was starved for love and she wanted her son to love her. She couldn't bear the thought of her little boy getting gifts from someone else when she couldn't give them. It had a pretty profound impact on me when I found out later.

And I would actually say that probably one of the most important things in my life was actually, to be very honest with you, was the fact that God gave me the grace not

only to forgive that quite inappropriate act but also to understand that a woman who had lost her mother and father before she was 11, married young as a very young teenager and was left by that husband and divorced, and then raped at age 40 by the man who was my father who impregnated her when he raped her on the job where she was working.

So here's a woman that had been hurt very badly and had placed me in foster care for a while until I was five, and then took me from that home and then the next 10 years we lived in terrible conditions.

You might say, "James, your mother should have let those people's gifts get to you." Yes, she should have but I want you to understand the greatness and grace of our God that he would not only enable me to forgive but to understand; that's how important love is to people.

I think, Betty, that's one of the reasons that God has given me some understanding of how people feel when they hurt and want to heal that hurt. So that's what we do when we give Christmas shoes and smiles; we do cleft palate surgery and we give these beautiful little shoes to put on little feet to give children not only the ability to play but to avoid disease that comes from infection, and even hookworms that can get into their brain and actually damage and even destroy their life.

I feel like all of you who watch us understand that the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts to be poured out on others like a river. That's what we do at *LIFE Today*. Together we share God's love.

So when we talk about Christmas Shoes and Smiles way ahead of Christmas, we're asking God to enable all of our viewers to see, this is a big deal to the missionaries, it is a big deal to the parents of these little children who can get ill or hurt themselves badly with no shoes but it's a real exciting time for shoes. Little kids will dance around. Betty, we've got a lot of pictures of little kids jumping up and dancing and they're the cutest things. Aren't they?

Betty: They really are. That's what makes me smile, on my face and in my heart when

I see these children. We give them the shoes, they start dancing. They're not only happy smiles -- they've got smiles on their faces but they've got happy feet because their feet have some covering on them to keep them from -- they may not fully understand why we gave them the shoes but boy, they like it! They love to receive the gift.

And we love to give it because we know the meaning of the shoes and that is to save a lot of their lives because when that disease starts at their feet and gets into their body it can destroy them.

James: Well, I think that when you just saw those little clips of children dancing just then, it had to put a smile on your face. Remember, we want to put smiles on the faces of little children that have a facial deformity or cleft palate, and those surgeries are \$500 each, which is quite remarkable; it is because of doctors who give their love, their skill, and their time.

I'm talking to you about understanding the importance of helping others and even feeling what somebody else feels as it relates to Christmas. Let me show you a very special -- a very special girl who really heard from the Lord and got a burden. I want you to watch what God enabled her to do because of love.

>> Over the years Monica has always been in Special Ed. She's always... her speech has always improved because there was a time when she was very young we didn't even know if she would ever say her name. We didn't know if she'd ever learn to write her name. This is who Monica has always been since she was a small child. This is just the first time we stepped out and let her be herself.

She has watched *LIFE Today* over and over again but for some reason when she saw this mission project, she was really captivated.

>> She told me, "Pastor David, I want to do this for the children." And she was just bubbling over with excitement, with joy. The morning that Monica got up on the stage and asked the church family for help was just an awesome feeling for me. And believe it or not, she stood in front of this entire church of 300 people and made that same plea to help the children have shoes.

>> For Monica it was never about how much money she had raised. I don't think she understood that part. She wanted to know how many children were getting shoes.

>> And it was amazing the response. Every Sunday, she would stand in our commons area with her basket and people would come by and just fill it up. And believe you me, Monica embodies that kingdom of God. She made this church come alive for missions.

>> She had collected a total of \$6,000.

>> Yeah, I did!

>> You did!

>> Uh-huh!

>> Through all this I now realize that she has been able to express herself using her own voice and her own words; not just to one person, but now all around the world.

Did I ever think -- did I ever think that she would be able to do this? No! But God did. He knew! She been passionate about it and she has done it and she has changed so many children's lives just because of her passion and her love to help someone else. And I just think that it is important that everyone knows that we all have a purpose. And no matter her mental ability or education or anything, we all have a call and we all have something that we can do.

>> Please help the children.

James: Well, mom, I want to say to you, you're a beautiful mother! Mom and dad, you're special. Monica, words don't even begin to communicate the depth of appreciation and love that we have for you.

And honey, let me just say to you in a very direct way, you're precious. You really did put the arms of Jesus around little children and we want to thank you, Monica. I want

to tell you something else, I believe that God is using you right now to inspire people all over the world that if you can do that they can do something.

Betty, I have longed for so many years, I don't think I'll ever quit praying something that I think is important. I have prayed that we would do things together, that there wouldn't be a single person watching who had the ability to do anything that would not say, "I'm going to help."

Let me explain to you how simple it is. These little shoes which are all-weather shoes, they're like shoes that are called "Crocs" and they're very expensive, and a lot of people wear them. I wear them; they're kind of my house shoes. But these are, in my opinion every bit as good as Crocs. They're made very similar.

But we can get these shoes for \$3.60 a pair. That's buying them in large numbers and we're trying to give away 200,000 pair. But I don't think there is anybody watching who couldn't give a pair of shoes.

But the thing I find with most people is when they're looking at 200,000 they say, "Well, I'd like to make a dent in that." \$36 and 10 people have shoes. The telephone number that will be there on the screen off and on is always there as a prayer line for you, but I think it is important for you to realize that it is not only a prayer line for you, it's a lifeline, it's a love line to let love lift somebody up.

There's a beautiful song, "Love Lifted Me." Well, it will lift others too when it is expressed through us. So if you would be like Monica and her family and say, "I'm going to do something," and every one of you today would say, "I'm going to give some shoes," we'll have the 200,000 pair. \$144 will give 40 pairs of shoes. That's remarkable! And the smiles are \$500 each for surgery; \$1,000 we've got two Christmas smiles.

We're going to be sending you a beautiful little Christmas ornament and right now it may be a little early for Christmas but that's a beautiful little shoe. And for those of you who will step up to give quite a few pairs of shoes we're going to send you all four

of the ornaments that we have offered over the last several years, including this year to say thank you.

So we're doing everything we can to express our gratitude in behalf of the children, their families, but also the missionaries who have planted their lives in the midst of need to not only tell people about God's love but show them what God's love looks like in action, not just in word but in deed.

I want you to look in at some of those scenes that Betty and I have enjoyed when we're reaching out in places, sometimes Betty we've been told "where angels fear to tread." I don't know, but the places these children tread is quite horrendous and dangerous for their little feet, especially. Well, just look in on it and see what it does to your heart to see these beautiful children that we love so much.

James: We want to give children like these, beautiful children shoes -- children all over the world. There goes another one! We want to give them shoes.

You know what Jesus said? "Suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not."

You know what? We are the representative of Christ. We are his body, we're his family and we can share his love. We love these little children. We're going to give these little children shoes. Look at these beautiful little feet!

Betty: They have nothing, really but they can still play, they can still have fun. They're children! I think that's what they're supposed to be instead of having to worry about walking around without any shoes where they step on stuff and hurt their feet and also get diseases through that too.

James: Betty, they just tough it out and they play but we found out right here in this area that hookworms get in the skin, maybe where they have a little tear in the skin,

get in the bloodstream, ultimately into the intestines and cause very serious disease and sometimes death.

Just look here! This boy has had a blowout in his tennis shoe! He has played so hard and gotten so dirty.

You need to wash your shirt, man!

Isn't it great to see? The kids, they want to have fun. We're going to love them with your help. We're going to give them good new shoes. We -- not me -- all of us together! Let's put shoes on all these beautiful children's beautiful feet! It would just be such a wonderful gift to make at this time and I hope you will do all you can. Just give as many pairs as you can to bless as many children and their families as you can.

James: You know Walt Disney did a movie called "Happy Feet." How about some of you folks down there in Florida that work with Disney, why don't y'all just kind of double up and say, "We'll send 200,000 pairs of shoes ourselves!" And that's some real happy feet.

I'm really challenging, Betty -- I'm challenging the business community and I don't see them as an enemy. I don't see corporations and businesses that provide jobs and opportunities and services and products, things that people really need or things that people want, don't necessarily need but want, I don't see them as an enemy. And I don't see entrepreneurs and small business owners as enemies. I don't see them as enemies.

I think we need to refocus our attention on how all of us together, like a great family of love, can reach out in love to others and really, not have to depend so much on some institution or entity or the federal government to always take care of everybody without any real compassion expressions. That's the thing that makes what we're able to do so beautiful. We're seeing the love of God through missionaries who literally

said to me and Betty, "Please don't stay here as a missionary. No matter how much your heart is broken for what you see, would you please go back home and tell the people what we're doing and what God is doing? And ask them to help so we can stay here and do the work."
