Week 10: WFL – Last Day
WFL Mission Special #2

James: I'm James Robison. My wife Betty and I welcome you to this very special program. I wish with all my heart that I could do everything possible to ease pain, especially the pain of a broken heart.

Betty and I have experienced a pain that many people say is as great as you can experience, and that is the loss of a child. Betty and I lost our youngest child, our daughter, our Robin. She was at the time the mother of three teenagers and we lost her right around Christmas so the holiday time always reminds us in a very deep way of that loss and that precious child, and mother and wife and wonderful example.

I don't think there is a person watching us right now that wouldn't say, "James, we wish we could alleviate the pain. We wish we could have given your daughter something that would have given her perfect health." You know what? I believe you. And I believe you would. I don't believe there is a person watching us right now that wouldn't say if we could hand people the cure for whatever is breaking their heart or destroying their life or their health or the health of a loved one, we would do it.

I want you to see something very real. This is perhaps one of the most real things in the world that's tragically too often overlooked. And what our viewers are going to see, Betty is perhaps the greatest killer -- and there is a perfect cure. I'm really not exaggerating. If you'll give us a few minutes we're going to show you how you can be the greatest healer of pain in many people's lives, families, and their communities -- and it's a perfect cure. Here's the situation and you really are the cure.

On the mission field

Announcer: 100 hours. On average, that is how long the human body can survive without water. In the face of death by dehydration, water like this is the only choice for many. Recently, while in East Africa, we spoke with Fatina, a mother personally impacted by this crisis.

>> One year ago, my child had a problem of diarrhea. So I tried to help him. When we went to the clinic, they said it was because we drink unclean water. While we were there, my child died.

Announcer: Unclean water is a common hardship throughout the world. And when something is common it is easy to get used to. But should losing a child ever be something we get used to?

Contaminated water has already taken Fatina's son. In Cambodia, Sumnang lost his daughter to a waterborne illness. Flores and Anita from Madagascar lost both their mother and three-year-old sister after they drank from a contaminated canal. At the time we visited these sisters, they were still drinking from that same water source themselves.

For years you've helped *LIFE Outreach* provide clean water in thousands of areas across the globe. Right now mothers like Fatina also need clean water in their villages before tragedy strikes again.

>> I am afraid that one day my remaining children will die because of the lack of safe water.

James: Let me just say this to you. Because of someone like you, we've been able to go into 6,000 -- 6,000 of those communities and villages and give life. Most of the areas that we're dealing with you can say they're about 1,000 people, average, in a village. Because of the love of God, we actually drilled one well that provides water for 250,000 people. Now obviously that

was quite a project. But the fact is, it became a miracle and it was a miracle of love.

What we have found that's very realistic and doable, Betty, we have missionaries working all over the third world and they're working with very poor people but they're very precious people -- more precious than we can describe and they really love their children. Their children is the greatest source of joy they've got. When we give them water in those little villages, it is an oasis of hope. And Betty, it works every time.

Betty: It really does. There's nothing like the loss of a child. I know, James knows, but as a mother, I know you don't ever get over it. With God's help you walk through the pain and God lifts that heaviness off of you but you never forget. I can look at a picture today of our daughter and I remember. I remember her being full of life. I think these mothers that are losing baby after baby over in these countries where they don't have the clean water, simple solution -- clean water! We can do that. I know their hearts break because they lose, many times, more than one child and their heart just gets broken over and over again.

We can stop that cycle. We can be the answer to their needs for their children in giving them fresh clean water. I hope you'll join us in doing that.

James: We want to give you that opportunity even now. You see there is a phone number there. You can dial that number and it becomes a life line. It is always a prayer line. You want someone to pray for you? We'll pray for you. But it is a life line.

I'm asking you right now to reach out and touch someone with love. Go get a bankcard, plan to use it like a check and just simply say, "I want to give Water for LIFE." The wells average \$4800 in those villages. You might be able to give a well. Many people tell us it's something they try to do at least once a year, drill a well. That's a wonderful goal. You may be able to give part of a well, \$1200, \$2400; pray three people join you or another person joins you and we've got a well. Most of the support comes with gifts of \$48 or \$144 as an example. With that gift, you're giving ten people water the rest of their life, if you break out the average, or 30 people.

Would you today reach out and touch someone with love? Thank you for doing it. Listen to this incredible story of heartache that you can help cure. Three grandchildren lost, a son lost, and we have the perfect cure. Let's be that cure.

>> Marie, I know it is very difficult to talk about these things. I know you're heartbroken and I'm sorry I can't do anything today to change that. But we want to share your story back with people who want to help. Can you tell me about that?

>> This year I have lost many family members. Three of my grandchildren, as well as my son have died.

They had skin ulcers and bloated bellies. I'm certain they got sick from drinking our water. I'm feeling very sad. I'm feeling very sad. It's very painful.

I think about giving children a bath and putting them to bed each night. I feel like dying so I could be with them.

As my son was dying he asked me to care for the other children. I have two grandchildren that are still alive. We have no choice but to drink this bad water, the same water that killed my family.

>> Our goal is to bring clean water to this village so that your two grandchildren that are still with you will survive.

>> Thank you.

James: I don't exaggerate when I tell you I wish I could just put arms around that precious grandmother and hold her because we do know how she feels. Our beautiful daughter has those three children that are married. She didn't get to be there at the weddings. She has a little granddaughter. She would have had so much fun.

Betty, you and I, and I don't want people to ever have to go through the kind of heartache we went through to understand how people hurt. I don't want you to hurt like that. But I don't want those mothers and grandmothers to hurt like that. I want to help them. The thing is, Betty, we actually can.

Betty: Absolutely. We can help them with this problem. It is the water. Do you understand? If they have clean water their children can live. But yet at the same time, while they're waiting on someone to rescue them, to bring life and hope to them, they still have to drink the diseased water. They have nothing else to offer those precious little children and grandchildren. But we do, we have a lot to offer. We offer hope and we offer life through giving and drilling the water wells. So please join with us. Let's be part of that hope for these precious, precious people.

James: I believe with all my heart you want to be. You may think that my heart is broken because of our daughter. Well, certainly it is. But it's broken for people like that precious woman and all the people we've seen all over the world that just need love.

And the greatest joy, even greater than all the beauty that we've seen with our children and 11 grandchildren, and now four great grandchildren, even more than all the joy we see with our family, is watching entire communities change because God's love was poured out on them through a channel of blessing like you. Six thousand communities -- six thousand areas where hope came in the form of clean water. We gave them a well of water.

Jesus said, "You give a cup of water in my name you won't lose your reward." I want you to know, I don't need any more reward than just watching the joy of those mothers and grandparents and families to see their children play and be healthy and not be sick because they get the one thing they've got to have and it kills them.

James: Oh boy! Your smile says it all, honey. I wish -- I wish you could hear me talking to you right now because it says so much. I started the program talking about losing a daughter, and Betty, it's just been a cycle of people seeing that and yet, that smile says that's what we can do. The people watching us can be the miracle that changes everything.

Betty: There are some situations where you do all you know to do but nothing helps. There is no solution, there is no cure for some diseases. But this is one that we have a cure for and it is drilling the water wells. We can stop this cycle of death that these mothers go through, this heartache that they go through over and over again because they still have to offer that diseased water to their babies. Please help us stop this cycle.

James: If you'd walked into our lives and you would have said, "Here's the cure." You might say, "Well, it's just one." But boy, it would be big to us. You see, you are the answer to the heartache and the heart cry and the prayers. That precious smile you saw, she'd had incredible, indescribable loss but now she sees hope. It won't bring back her loss but it will stop the loss of her others.

Would you do that? Would you be that miracle right now? Reach out and touch someone with love. Go and get your bankcard. Tammy: I'm sitting here on the edge of the water in Burundi, Africa with this little boy. When I look at his belly, it is not because he's just had a great big meal; it's actually because he's been drinking this water. I fear that if he continues to drink this water, he probably won't make it.

I don't even know if I would call this water. It is filthy. It is so dirty. It is filled with contamination and I know he is in the condition he is in because he's been drinking this water. If we could come in here and drill a well, where he could drink off of that water instead of this filthy, dirty water, I've seen it work before. I know that it works. I know that it turns around quickly for these children.
