RANDY: Welcome to *LIFE Today*! A very special *Life Today*. I'm Randy Robison. Sheila Walsh is with me.

SHEILA: Hey!

RANDY: I know it is early but we're going to talk to you about Christmas. Because if you've seen our *Christmas Shoes and Smiles*, you know what is going on and you'll be excited. RANDY: It absolutely does. And here is sort of the simple outline of what we're talking about. Many people in this world don't have a simple pair of shoes. And so what we like to do is we go and give them shoes. We distribute them around the world in the places of the greatest need. We've been doing this for many, many years. I think it's like approximate two and a half million pairs of shoes that we've given, and it is all because of people just like you. So what we're inviting you to do is take a look at this and just say maybe this is something I can do. Because it

is not -- it is very economical. It is a big deal in the sense of the impact it has but it is not a big deal when you compare it to other types of Christmas shopping.

I know, Sheila, we, I'm the hard guy to buy for in my family because I'm the dad. I've got everything I need. A lot of times at Christmas, I think we kind of get over into areas where it's just kind of going through the motions. I think this puts a little something special into it.

SHEILA: I totally, I totally agree. That's why we love this so much. I know you're thinking: you're talking about Christmas already? Well, the thing is we have to have everything in place so we can get everything delivered on time and make this probably the best Christmas for so many families.

You might not think that a pair of shoes makes a difference, but do you know that in so many of the countries where we work it can literally save a life? Children are running around on stones, they get cuts on their feet, they get hookworm, all sorts of things, and simply giving a gift of a pair of shoes can change the life of a child.

RANDY: Yeah, I think we should show them something. Take a look at this and then we'll tell you how you can be involved in this very special outreach this Christmas. Let's start thinking about it now, Christmas is coming quickly, and we want to be ready. Watch this.

SHEILA: A pivotal point in human history was the birth of Jesus. It changed everything! I think it is amazing that he didn't come to be born in a palace or some fancy place that might have made it seem as if salvation was only available to those who were of a certain social standing. No! He came to the most despised of all, shepherds who were spat on if they tried to go through the town, weren't allowed to ever speak up in a trial. That's the gift that we have been given.

So because of that, what a wonderful privilege we have to make this Christmas not about us, not about consumerism, not about buying everything they advertise on television, but something as simple as a little shoe. We managed to get these made for \$3.60, which means Randy that for \$36 we can give ten children the very first pair of shoes they've ever had in their life.

RANDY: Yeah, and not just manufactured but distributed. We have people in place right now in various parts of the world who are ready to go and give the shoes to the children that need them most. You know, there is a health aspect to this, but I think it is just the act of giving. Sheila, when we just go to someone and we give them something that they need but they also enjoy, we see these kids out there running and jumping the first time they put their shoes on. They get so excited. It is the joy of giving! And it is the joy of giving around Christmas because we give in the name of Jesus Christ.

And so yeah, like you said \$36 for shoes for ten children, I think that's a level we can all just say yeah, I can do that. Some of you can give 20 children shoes. You can provide 20 children with shoes for only \$72; \$180 will give 50 children a pair of shoes. Oftentimes, the first pair of shoes they've ever had, and the joy, sometimes even the dignity, but also the protection from some of the diseases. I did not know, Sheila until we started doing this, that hookworm was a thing.

SHEILA: Four hundred million children!

RANDY: There are so many children that are impacted by hookworm! And it does terrible things to you. It can actually lead to death. It can disfigure the feet and it is horrible. It is ugly. That's why I love the beauty of us coming in and saying, here's something. A simple gift that will possibly change your life, could even save your life, but most of all, bless you this Christmas time. I love it!

SHEILA: I do, too. And there is one other thing that will radically change the life of a child. If a child is born with cleft lip, cleft palate, in so many of the nations where we work it is almost looked on as a curse from God. They are shunned, they are kept away from normal society. Can you imagine as a mom or as a dad, the first time you pick up your darling little baby and you see

this thing that's going to -- they can't eat properly, they can't sleep properly? But we work with so many amazing doctors like the gentleman you just saw, and do you know that for \$500 we can do a whole surgery on a child and give them a smile that they've never been able to do in their lives? What a gift to the whole family. It suddenly says to this little one, you belong, you have dignity, you have hope, you have a future. And that's what it means to be a follower of Christ. When we've taken care of their needs, we've earned the right to tell them whose name we came in. We came in the name of the Lord. Watch this and see what a difference that will make.

>> My name is Dr. Joseph Theuri. I'm a surgeon who does many operations that include the repair of cleft lip and palate deformities. Okay, let's pray. We pray that You're going to guide us through this procedure to enable us to get a good correction.

Cleft lip and palate deformities are very common in Kenya. For the cleft lip, the child has a split lip, usually the upper lip. For the cleft palate, usually there is a hole in the palate. Once they are born, there are quite a lot of effects. Usually, when someone sees a person with a deformity of the face, it is very conspicuous. And that kind of brings a lot of shame to the family. And a lot of children tend to be hidden as a result of that.

A cleft palate has a more challenging, functional problem because children with a cleft palate have problems; difficulties feeding when they are young. Because of that, children usually have malnutrition when they are young. Repair of both of these deformities is able to forestall all these types of problems. So a child that has a cleft lip that is repaired is able to lead a normal life. When someone has a cleft palate, the function of that child and the social interaction, and also opportunities are better when all these are repaired at a young age.

We'd like to thank James and Betty and their friends of *LIFE Outreach International*. We believe that their support will help us to reach more children and be able to treat children with cleft lip and cleft palate. But we know that there are very many children that are not treated, and they are

out there in our country. This type of intervention is going to help treating these children. And these children will be able to grow normal lives and be able to access opportunities of life just like any other child in our country.

On top of that, all the shoes put a smile on the faces of these children.
