Studio discussion:

SHEILA: Welcome to *LIFE Today*. I'm Sheila Walsh. And I'm so glad that you're going to spend the next few minutes with me. I have a slight confession to make upfront. Have you ever had one of those moments where you're caught in something that seems important and then you think how ridiculous it is when you put it into the perspective of everything else that is going on in the world?

So this morning, I don't know why I did this, but I decided to weigh myself. Never a good thing to do before you've had your coffee. And I was kind of frustrated with myself because I have all these great ideas of what I'm going to do and how I'm going to eat healthier and all that stuff. And the scale basically said to me, come back when you're alone. So it was clear that things were not going well.

And then I came downstairs, and I thought about today. I thought about being here in the studio at *LIFE* and the incredible privilege I have of a perspective that perhaps all of you don't have. I've been able to travel to different parts of the world and see the real needs that are going on. And also, to see the difference that you and I can make.

So I was sitting down at my desk, and I was viewing the different pieces I'm going to share with you today. And suddenly, I was just overwhelmed with the sense of how easy it is for me to get caught up in my own life at moments and forget the bigger picture. For those of us, for you and I who love Jesus, we're on this planet for a purpose. We're not just here by accident at this time in human history. We're here for a purpose. And what is that purpose? That's what I began as I watched the final pieces beginning to roll, I found myself sitting there at my desk with tears rolling down my face thinking how quickly I

could have forgotten some of the things that are going on not months ago, not years ago, but at this very moment. And also remembering some of the women that I met on some of my trips.

I'll tell you what I did expect, and I'll tell you what absolutely blew me away. I knew the first time that I was flying to Africa, and I would be on a Mission Feeding trip, I knew that I would have to see children who are severely malnourished and hurting, clinging to life. I knew that I would meet their moms. And as a mom myself, sitting beside them, watching, trying to see through their eyes as their little ones struggle, I knew that. Now you're never prepared for how brutal it is, but it was in my mind and my heart.

Here's what I was not prepared for. I was not prepared for the praying women I met. These women, living in abject poverty with nothing to feed their children weren't worrying about what they might look like in a reflection. What they were doing was looking at their children who are suffering. But then what they were doing was they were getting on their knees under an African sky and lifting their requests to God. These are amazing women. I want you to meet one or two of them. Watch this.

SHEILA: When I'm on a mission's trip, my heart is continually touched by mothers facing some of life's most devastating situations.

>> As a mother, I feel like a failure because two of my children died. It starts with lack of food. Then malnutrition leads to other terrible diseases. It's really hard for me to think back to the times when they passed away.

SHEILA: This is Armeda. Can you begin to imagine the crushing impact of losing your

children because you could not feed them? It was devastating for Armeda, but she knows she must carry on for her other children. How does she manage it? Through fervent prayer.

Open Captions: Jesus is the only hope we have, when we go to sleep, we pray, "Jesus, thank you for sustaining us for another day."

SHEILA: I would love to tell you Armeda's story of losing her children because of a lack of food is rare, but it is not. These women, by show of hands, shared how many children they each had lost. They well know the same heartache as Armeda.

Mandolina lost five children. Yngo, two children. Margarita, one child. Julia, three children.

One thing all these precious mothers have in common through prayer is they put their hope for tomorrow in the hands of Jesus.

I will never forget that here in this village, my sister in Christ gets down on her knees even though she may not be kneeling on a carpet, she might be kneeling on sand or dirt, but we are thanking the same God for his provision that day in absolute confidence that the God who is with us today will be with us tomorrow.

God is moving in Africa, and you and I get to be a part of it.

Studio appeal:

SHEILA: I love what James said, "If you want an answer to prayer, be an answer to someone else's prayer." You know what? That very first trip that I took left an impact on me that honestly has only increased because the situation in so many areas of the world is getting worse and worse. The great irony of a place like Africa is that you can have one area where it is devastation because of flooding, and then you can have another area

where it's devastation because they haven't seen rain in over a year.

I watched. These mothers are not women who sit around hoping that someone will come and give them a handout. No, I've watched them digging through the dirt looking for anything that they could give their child.

The first lady that we saw there on that first piece, did you notice she had the name Jesus written on her headband? One of the things I was so struck by was she said, "At the end of the day we thank the Lord for his provision for one more day." And what they have is almost nothing. But I think sometimes when you literally have nothing, and then you find a little something you're so aware of the fact that your dependence is completely on the Lord.

And perhaps we forget that. We have so much that we forget that literally, every good gift comes from the Lord. But watching our sisters on their knees praying -- I read something, I used to work with an organization called Tear Fund in England, and I get their newsletter. I read it this morning and it said this, "Poverty and malnutrition are never God's will. We are. We are the answer to those prayers."

Sometimes we think, well, I could never go and be a missionary. The Lord doesn't need all of us to do that. We have our partners who are on the ground right now waiting. We've made a commitment at *LIFE* to feed 350,000 children this year. And when we talk to our partners, we'll present the need. We'll help our people understand.

So that's what I'm asking if we'll all do something. \$30 will feed three children for three months. You can't feed three children with \$30 at a restaurant on one night here. \$50 will feed five children. \$100 will feed ten children for three whole months!

One of my friends has started a campaign that I loved, and it is called "Skip it." Skip one thing you don't need to be able to give children something that they literally cannot live without. Sometimes we think, how do these crises happen? What led up to those children

being in that situation? Well, that's a great question. Would you watch this? and I think it will answer that question for you. Watch this.

ISAK: People often ask me, "What does crisis look like? When you say, 'There's a crisis in the field,' what is that?" This is the picture of crisis. Mother after mother here, they're in the screening clinic for malnutrition. You can see how overcrowded it is. Mothers that have come here in absolute desperation.

Crisis is when there are more mothers than we can handle. Crisis is when there is not enough food for each and every child. Crisis is when the silent killer of malnutrition comes in and starts to literally rob the lives of each and every one of these children. But I need you to understand where their crisis starts. It doesn't start here. This is where it ends and many times it ends with a tragic ending. But this crisis starts from the village. It starts because of failed crops due to the worst drought in 40 years in this area. It starts because the mother is not able to produce enough food to feed her family. It starts because a child goes to bed without a meal that day, and the next and the next. That is how this crisis starts.

It's not because these mothers are not doing everything they can to provide for their children; it's because everything they can is not enough. How do we change that, you ask? We change it by reaching the mothers out in the villages. We change it by bringing Mission Feeding to those mothers, providing that bowl of food each and every day. The nutrients that that child needs, that's how we avert this crisis. Not here in the clinic! By the time we get here, many times it is too late.

So please, help us today to take Mission Feeding to the mothers out in the villages. I can give you a guarantee that we will literally bring hope to those mothers and life to those children.

SHEILA: Hope and life! That's the kingdom of God. That Jesus came to give life to each one of us. And because of the hope that we have been given, we get to reach out and make a difference.

I could almost guarantee that if you and I could get on a flight tomorrow and fly over there, and you saw with your own eyes what was going on, you would do everything within your power to help alleviate the suffering of these children.

But the great thing is that's why we bring these stories to you because it is not practical for us all to get on a flight and go. So we bring the children to you. That precious little one at the end, when you see that skin peeling away, that's one of the effects of malnutrition where there is simply not enough nutrients or protein in the body. What we want to do and Isak, we love working with the Pretorius family. His dad and mom started it and he's carrying on his father's work, Peter Pretorius.

But the thing that we want to do is we want to get to the villages before the children end up in the malnutrition clinics. And we can do it. And so I'm asking you, I'm asking you to help us. We want to feed 350,000 children. We've broken it down in such a way that every single one of us, whether you're a teenager with an allowance, whether you're a successful businessman, whether you're a stay-at-home mom, whether you're a retiree, every single one of us can do something. \$30 will feed three children for three months. \$50 will feed five children for three whole months!

SHEILA: Some of you have written and said sometimes, "Do you ever get a chance to

go back to those villages? You show us a situation, do you ever get to go back?" So we really wanted you to see that very immediate answer to prayer. That darling woman crying out, "If you don't come back, we will die." And three weeks later, Isak was able to go back with the team.

But let me tell you, there are women in hundreds of other villages and their cry is the same and the need is now. And we can only do this if you will help us. We have promised 350,000 children, that's our commitment, we would love to blow that out of the water, honestly, because the need is so great. And if those of us who claim the name of Christ took that seriously in terms of when Jesus said, "I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty and you gave me water."

Whenever we reach out in Jesus' name, it's as if we're literally feeding the Lord, reaching out and touching him because he is with those who are hungry and suffering. That's where you always found Jesus. He was always with the broken, with the downtrodden, with the forgotten.

But whenever we go into these villages we tell them, "You are not forgotten. We will come back, and we will tell your stories." And it is the most glorious thing in the world to be able to then go back and let them see we're not just coming to tell you about a God who loves you.

First of all, we're going to come and show you how he loves you; that we're going to help feed you, help take care of your children. So often we set up the feeding programs in the school, so the children have to come to school to get their meals. And then it breaks that cycle of poverty and illiteracy that goes from generation to generation.

We believe -- we're believing that in that great continent of Africa that God is going to raise up men and women to be leaders in their nations, but it starts with something so simple. It starts with you and it starts with me saying, yep, I'm not just going to sit and watch this. I'm going to go and pick up my phone and I'm going to dial that number on

the screen and I'm going to make a commitment. Even \$30 would feed three children for three months. If you're able to give \$100 that would feed ten children. And if God has blessed you and you think you know what? I could give \$1,000 some of you could do that. Do you know that would feed 100 children for three months? What a blessing!

So often I think we forget that we're on this planet just for a short time, it is like a vapor. And then one day Jesus is coming back, and we are going home. Wouldn't it be wonderful to see so many children, faces from around the world who could say I am here because you reached out in Jesus' name?

So please, would you go to your phone? Would you go online, would you just give the best gift that you can do, and let's change this world in Jesus' name? There are a lot of women on their knees right now in huts all across Africa saying God, can you hear my prayer? Let's be the answer to that prayer.
