## **Studio Discussion**

**RANDY ROBISON**: Welcome to "Life Today," I'm Randy Robison. Great to have you with us.

**TAMMY TRENT**: And it's great to have them with me, too, and you.

**RANDY**: We're just all glad you're here, and we're here, and we have someone else that we want to introduce you to. Now, his name is Jimmy Darts, and if you know that name, then you know who he is. But for those of you who don't, Tammy, I'd like to maybe, before we talk to him, give 'em an idea of what he does.

**TAMMY**: I think we should, because it will set the tone for the conversation.

**RANDY**: Yeah, okay, so his book is called "Undercover Kindness."

TAMMY: Yes.

RANDY: And that's what he does.

**TAMMY**: Yes, he's a man on a mission. You guys are gonna love this mission.

**RANDY**: I love it, so take a look at this, and we'll be right back with Jimmy Darts.

**JIMMY**: I'm sorry, I haven't eaten anything today. I'm trying to get these. Do you have a spare dollar?

**LANI**: Oh, okay, all right.

**JIMMY**: Are you sure?

LANI: A dollar, you say?

**JIMMY**: I'm just a dollar short for this. Thank you so much. What's your name?

LANI: Lani.

**JIMMY**: Are you sure? Thank you so much.

**LANI**: You need a dollar only, or two dollars?

**JIMMY**: Two would be great, thank you. Thank you so much, I'm Jimmy, good to meet you.

LANI: Hi Jimmy, nice to meet you.

**JIMMY**: Why did you help me?

**LANI**: You want cereal?

**JIMMY**: Yeah, you're just, you're just so kind, thank you. These are for you.

LANI: Oh, it's for you.

JIMMY: No, no, it's for you, open it up.

**LANI**: What is this?

**JIMMY**: It's \$1,000 for you, for your kindness. God loves you so much.

**LANI**: My husband is in the hospital.

JIMMY: What's going on?

**LANI**: He's got cancer. Can you give me a hug?

JIMMY: Bless you.

**LANI**: It's very hard, because my husband is the one who made money for us. I have only a part-time job.

JIMMY: Where do you work?

**LANI**: Dollar Tree, and my car is gonna be towed. I can't afford it.

**JIMMY**: Are you afraid that you might get evicted?

LANI: Can I give you a hug.

JIMMY: Yes, you're so amazing.

**TAMMY**: Oh, I cry every time, Randy. I cry every time, because it's like ordinary moments that's someone's miracle, and that's what Jimmy does. Like, every video that I watch of Jimmy's, I am moved deeply, because it's deeply affecting someone's life, it's changing their lives, and it's just ordinary moments of kindness, but God has put him on assignment, and I feel like everyone is a very specific assignment that ends up turning into something spectacular. Jimmy Darts, I am so glad you're with us today. It is great to have you here, man, and all that you're doing, all that God is doing in and through you, and I can't imagine where that journey started, but I think that we need to start with that part of your life, like where this all began. Tell us the story of your life, little Jimmy.

JIMMY: Yeah, absolutely, thanks so much for having me here. Honestly, after watching that I'm like, man, you should have Lani here. She should be the one you're interviewing, you know, these are the real undercover heroes, and I'm just the person capturing it, putting the story together, and helping these people out, you know? She was just the sweetest lady ever. We ended up raising over \$100,000 for her, and after that, I went to the hospital to see her husband. He was in the hospital bed, you know, with cancer, and I was like, hey, is there any way I can pray for him? And so I grabbed his hand, just said a prayer for him, and, you know, just wanted to bless him, and then sure enough, a few days later, the son texted me. He's like, "My dad said as soon as you like grabbed his hand, all the pain in his body left." And so he ended up getting discharged from the hospital, healed of cancer. The Lord healed him, and we raised over 100,000-some dollars for him. So it was just so, so powerful to be a part of this.

But, yeah, this really started back when I was a kid. My parents for one Christmas, they say, hey Jimmy, instead of gifts this year, we're giving you \$200 in cash. So I was jumping up and down, doing backflips off the couch. And they go settle down, settle down, half of it you gotta give away to a stranger. I'm like what? A tithe is 10%. What do you mean I gotta give half of it away? And sure enough, you know, they were just trying to install generosity in me and a heart for other people at a young age. And we were driving in Minneapolis, Minnesota. I saw this guy just freezing out in the cold, so I jumped out of the car, hand him a \$100 bills, and just the look on his face, you know, he had probably gotten middle fingers, change thrown at him all day and just to see a kid hand him a crisp \$100 bill, knowing he could get a jacket, a meal that night. It's wild, but looking back at it, you know, I'm 29 years old now, and I have no clue what I bought with the other \$100. I just remember the look on

that man's face, and so after that happened, you know, I just kind of grew up in the church, but you know, you could be in a garage all day, and that doesn't make you a car, you know?

So I didn't really have a heart for the Lord or didn't know the Lord until I was 18 years old, and that's when I saw a Billy Graham video on YouTube called "Choices," and when I saw that video, I realized, man, the gospel is way more severe than I ever thought, but it's also way more incredible than I ever thought, and that's when I got on my knees, gave my life to the Lord, and just wanted him to use me for whatever he wanted to do. And sure enough, I've been doing this now for about five years, just capturing the generosity and the people in this country. You know, so often the news is highlighting all these stories, but I'm like, man, if you go around, there's amazing people. And so my prayer, whenever I run into these people, I'm just like, God, you know, there's a million people that are going through something, but lead me to that one person that maybe has been praying day and night for a miracle to come, and if I can be just that instrument in that moment, you know, I'll be happy. And so it's a blessing to be able to get to do this.

**RANDY**: From a practical level, how does this work? Because you gotta have money to give away money, you know? And then, you know, the social media aspect of it, the technology, obviously, but how did you find that place? Because everybody would–like I'd love to be the guy that just gives away money for a living, right? You know, but how did it come about in the format you're in?

JIMMY: Yeah, I mean, really, you know, just the Bible talks so much about, you know, steward what you have, be faithful in little, and you'll be given much, so I knew I wasn't gonna be like, man, tomorrow I'm gonna start giving away cars and houses and, you know, hundreds of thousands of dollars. I knew I had to start small, and so practically how it got going, I began to go across the country, and I made family friendly videos where I was like, man, if I can get an audience to around a million followers, I know I'll be able to then do what I really wanna do, which is to change lives full time. So when I had no money, I was doing stuff where, yeah, I would, you know, went to Mount Rushmore, and I said attention everybody, I found the lady of my dreams, and it'd be some random 70-year old lady. I'd be like, and I proposed to her right there, and she'd be like what is going on? And yeah, I'd just do a bunch of hilarious things. I'd go to Denny's and sit down at a restaurant, I'd say, so sorry I'm late, and they'd just look at me like what in the world are you doing, you know?

And so I was like, man, God created humor, the devil perverts it, so we can have a good time with good fun. And so it just snowballed from there and, you know, started with, yeah, giving a few dollars away to a few hundred dollars to a few thousand. And really what we do, the cool thing if you've seen the videos is I really start with asking someone for help, and when they help me, we give them \$500 usually. That's what we give them. And then that video goes on the internet, and it's up to the public to decide how much they get blessed. And so, usually, you know, every time, almost \$50 to hundreds of thousands of dollars comes in for these people, and yeah, it's just really so cool to see. I always say it's

like the opposite of the lottery. You know, when people win the lottery they're trying to get rich, so that blessing falls on the foundation of greed. But when these people, when this blessing comes, it fell on the foundation of generosity, and so they steward it way better than the average lottery winner would, you know?

**TAMMY**: Totally, Jimmy, do you remember the first time you ever had an–that you actually did a random act of kindness? Do you remember that first encounter? Now, of course we know, I think you said that the guy, the homeless guy, but like you actually grabbed your camera and said this is what I'm gonna do. Do you remember what that first one was like and how it made you feel?

JIMMY: Yeah, yeah, one of the very first ones I did, I was in Miami, Florida, and I was walking on the beach, and I see this guy living in a tent. And I'm like you know what? I'm gonna just ask him to be friends for the day. I'm like, hey, man, I don't know if you got any buddies, but you wanna be friends for the day? He had nothing to do, and so he looked at me, he goes, "Sure, I'm down." And so I'm like, all right, so we went roller skating, we played basketball, we did all these fun, silly things, and on the drive home, he just starts like breaking down in the car, and he's like, man, like I felt like giving up so many times, and life's been so hard, and I was like, man, I didn't realize how much he was going through. And so I was like, man, you don't happen to have like Cash App on your phone, do you? And he's like, yeah. I'm like, all right, I'm gonna put your Cash App at the end of this video and see what happens. And so I uploaded the video, and it had like 10,000 views in a couple of hours, so it wasn't doing very well. I was like, man, this guy probably got, you know, three bucks donated to him. And so I was like should I keep the video up? And I kept it up, and the next morning I wake up, and it's over 10 million views, and he's calling me, and he's going, Jimmy, I got over \$20,000 in my Cash App. And I'm like, no way, this is wild. Like, this must be a one-off, you know? Like there's no way people in America wanna continually give to strangers they've never met, but then I filmed the second video, the third, the fourth, and every time, these people come out of nowhere, and the cool thing is, yeah, there's a lot of Christians that follow my content and give to these people, but it's also a lot of non-Christians, and I always like to say, you know, yes, we're all born into sin and need to be born again, but we're also made in the image of God, and so there is this massive desire to just love even in people that don't know the Lord, and they ultimately find that place and that fullness of that in knowing who their father is, but I feel like, you know, people see these videos, and their heart just breaks, and that we were all designed to give, we were all designed to live like that, and so it's just really cool to see.

**RANDY**: Do you ever get any negative comments?

**JIMMY**: Man, I don't know. I don't really read the comments too much, yeah. Because once heard someone say it's like, man, if you live by the praise of man, you'll die by their criticism. And so, you know, even the good comments, I don't care about those, or don't even read those, you know?

**RANDY**: Okay, well, let me then, why do you do it? Who are you trying to please? Does it feel good for you? Do you think you're helping some people? Or you feel like you're doing what God's called you to do?

**JIMMY**: Yeah, yeah, absolutely. It's just, I feel like it's what the Lord called me to do. I was sitting on my porch one day. Actually, I gotta correct myself, not my porch, my dad's porch. I was, after college and going to school, I was back in Minnesota working at my dad's restaurant, and I was sitting on his front porch, and I was sitting out there one day, and he just goes, "Jimmy, what do you wanna do with your life?" And I was like, shoot, I guess it must not be working for you, you know? And so I'm like, what do I wanna do with my life? I mean, I know this job doesn't exist, but I would just love to go around the country and be like a Santa Claus year round, share the gospel with people, like, you know, pull people out of debt, out of different situations, and just love on them like crazy, but there's nowhere on Craigslist to apply for that, it doesn't exist. And he just looks at me, and he goes, "Start tomorrow." I'm like start tomorrow, what? And I was like start tomorrow? And I went to my room, and I was kind of offended. I was like my dad's too old school, he doesn't know, you can't just start tomorrow, and I had kind of come from a charismatic background of some different ministry schools I had gone to, and I was just like, man, well, you can't just start tomorrow. Like you gotta have a dream, a vision, like, you gotta have- a door has to be open. You don't wanna strive, all these, you know, over-spiritualized terms that are, you know, sometimes in the right place, but the enemy can use them against you. And I sat in my room right there, and I had this revelation. I was like, man, the world has amazing drive but lacks so much purpose, and the church has so much purpose but lacks drive. If I can combine drive with purpose, what can God do? So I got in my car the next day, started going around the country, and it's just when it started happening, and so that's what I'd like to say to people out there. It's like, man, if God's put something on your heart, go after it, go do it, you know, it's not gonna be perfect right from the start, like you're gonna grow in the process of doing it, you know? And maturity, you know, comes from just living life with God, you know? Like, it's great, you know, be in your prayer closet, be on your knees, but then get sent out from there, and you know, don't keep your relationship with Jesus just to yourself, you know? I think the fruit to show that you really do believe is if you're sharing the gospel. If you're not sharing the gospel, I don't know how you could really believe the story of Jesus's death and resurrection. Like it's just-it's impossible. Like, you know, we get a new car or a new T-shirt, and we tell everybody. It's like if you really believed the Son of God came, died to forgive you of everything you've ever done, ripped out your heart of stone, gave you a heart of flesh, and wants to just lavish you with his love, and I don't know how you can't be vocal about that.

**TAMMY**: Exactly, how has sharing kindness, how has that impacted or changed your life? When everything, the dust is all settled and done, and what if God changed plans for you tomorrow, Jimmy, and said, no, we got something totally different. I'm asking you to lay this down. Could you sit there in your home and look back and go, okay, we've changed many lives together, Lord, but this is how it's impacted my life, thank you for this?

**JIMMY**: Yeah, absolutely. Yeah, anything that God gives you in life, you have to have with an open hand, you know? You know, it's like if God gives me something in my hands like this, and he wants to give me something else, it's just gonna fall and hit the ground. So, when we're generous, when we give, you know, you can easily even turn your calling into an idol, you know? So, whatever you're called to do, like, you know, you always have to have an open hand with the Lord. So I'm always down for any new adventures or whatever the Lord has for me.

**TAMMY**: I love it, because you're listening to Holy Spirit as well. When he asks you to do something, you come across to me as a man that steps into it, like call me, I will go, I'll be faithful, whatever it is, God, I want to live with purpose. I think that's what you do, Jimmy, every single day.

JIMMY: Yeah, thank you. I mean, I try. I'm definitely not perfect by any means, but I just try to be obedient to him, and I feel like, you know, that verse where it's just like you guys probably know it better than me where it's like the the spirit of the Lord is, you know, hovering over the earth looking to see if he can find faith anywhere, and so it's like, man, like we wanna live with faith. Like, when we live with faith and we take risks, you know, just there's so much God wants to do, but he's just looking to see if people will be obedient to him. And I always tell people, I'm like, man, the definition of success is so important how you define that. If you define it by numbers or souls or this or that, all these metrics that could be good, you still miss the point. Success looks like just obedience to did you hear what he said and did you do what he said? You know, if he tells you to start a podcast tomorrow and you got five viewers, well, that's successful because you were obedient to what God said, and so, so many people get discouraged, because they're like, well, it doesn't look like my next door neighbor, this or that, and so, yeah.

**RANDY**: Yeah, and when it comes to generosity, it can be a little tough at times, because you have to have discernment, and I think the bottom line, and this is true across life, it's hearing God's voice and obeying. I mean, we like formulas and things like that. That's the only one I've found that's consistently true, hear the voice of God and obey, act on it. So, you've got a lot of stories, you got a lot of, of course, videos people can go watch those online, but I really wanna talk about some of the people and some of the stories, some of the impact, both for the individuals, and then even for those who jumped in and have, you know, been a part of the blessing. We're running out of time. Can you come back on another program and hit some of these for us?

**JIMMY**: Oh yeah, anytime you need me to, you know, give me a call, and I'll be there.

**RANDY**: Well, okay, we're gonna hang on. We'll hang on right here for the viewer. It'll be on another program. You can always see those at lifetoday.org, by the way, but I have to ask you about the book, right? Because it's great seeing you do the stories, but what are you trying to communicate in "Undercover Kindness," the book? Yeah, my whole heart for the

book is really to show people that, yes, God wants to be Lord of your life, but he wants to also be your friend. And I think when people think of him as just only Lord, and he doesn't want to interact daily as a friend or as a father, you think of him more like this boss, you check in, the CEO, youin with once a month, and, you know, go to church once a week, but no, he wants to interact with you 24/7, 7 days a week, and so friendship with God has changed my life just so massively and understanding that, you know, the kingdom of God is made up of righteousness, peace, and joy. And it's like, man, God is fun and holy at the same time, they're not interchangeable, you know? It says he who sits in the heavens laughs, and the enemy comes to pervert humor and pervert all these things, but if we can live joyfully as a Christian, I think that will be one of the loudest testimonies ever, because who wants to take advice from someone that looks like they don't wanna live another day, you know? So, I think, man, get ahold of the gospel, and this book is really to get the church to, you know, in fun, different practical ways to, you know, be the hands and feet of Jesus. Like, yeah, talk about the Lord. There's this quote people always say, they say preach the gospel and use words if necessary. That's a powerful quote, but I always say, well, you better use words also. They need to hear the gospel, you know? So you can't just be the nicest guy on the planet and just zip your lip about Jesus Christ, you know? So, yeah, obviously, you know, live it out, but really share your faith, too, and so I hope this book emboldens people that do that.

**TAMMY**: It will, oh my goodness, and I can't wait. We're gonna talk on the next show about God healed my socks, because I'm really into what that's all about.

**RANDY**: Oh, you know, actually you can get the book, if you would like today. And there's something Jimmy said that I think is really powerful, and his dad told him, you know, start tomorrow, but I would say start even today, right? I mean, I get the context there. But are we just going to proclaim our faith or even quietly, you know, have our own faith, or are we going to express it? The way we express it is by meeting that need, and start right now. And right now there's a dire situation where people are in desperate need, and they need your help, and the good news is we can help them. Watch this and pray about how you can answer someone's desperate prayer.

## **Cause Spot**

**ANNOUNCER**: In villages across Africa, the harvest that once sustained families are vanishing. Fields lie barren, and food supplies have all but disappeared. For mothers, the cost is devastating. Malnutrition is setting in, robbing their children of the strength and hope they need to survive. They are left with only one choice, walk long distances to a malnutrition clinic like this, clinging to the hope that someone can help their child survive.

**ISAK PRETORIUS**: This is the picture of crisis, mother after mother here in a screening clinic for malnutrition. You can see how overcrowded it is. Mothers that have come here in

absolute desperation. Crisis is when there's more mothers than we can handle. Crisis is when there's not enough food for each and every child. Crisis is when the silent killer of malnutrition comes in and starts to literally rob the lives of each and every one of these children. [music]

**ANNOUNCER**: Now, nearly two years later at this very same clinic where mothers were once offered a lifeline, hope is fading due to critically-depleted food and medical resources.

**ISAK**: The reality is that there isn't food in the warehouses here, which means there isn't food to distribute to mothers who bring their malnourished children. And so today, the absence of those mothers and the deafening silence of not a single child here is literally terrifying. Terrifying, because it means those mothers are left in their villages without the help that they so desperately need. It means those children that normally would be measured here and given the nutrition that will save their lives are left to fight on their own.

**RANDY**: Having been there, I can tell you sadly, those children left to fight on their own won't fare very well. Yes, we like to have room in the clinics, because we're in the villages with the mission feeding program, but what we're seeing now where they're not even able to make it, it's a long journey, for some of them a day or two or three to one of the clinics, it's not a good sign. Well, we can step up, we can do more, but we can only do it with your help, and we've been talking about "Undercover Kindness" with Jimmy, and I'm just curious what you think when you see some of the situations where, I know your heart is, man, because you just wanna help people.

**JIMMY**: Yeah, it's sad, it's heartbreaking, and we have to take responsibility, you know? The gospel is the gospel of responsibility, not just receiving, receiving. We need to receive from the Lord and give to others, and so, yeah, I lived in a mission—I lived in India for a while doing missionary work, and just the stuff I saw there was just absolutely wild.

**RANDY**: And so, you know, it's not just the gospel in word but in deed. I mean, we have to demonstrate the gospel as we preach it, and that's what I love about what you do.

**JIMMY**: Yeah, your words are only so much, you know, talk is cheap. It's really the life we live, you know, shows what we believe internally, and so, yeah, we need to take responsibility of that and know also that you can't go broke by giving, you know? When the Lord sees that you're generous, he can entrust you with more, you know? And so, yeah, I think just any time and every time there's an opportunity to give, we need to step in there and be there for other people.

**RANDY**: Yeah, yeah, and you know what Jimmy showed us is that it doesn't take a lot of money really to make a big difference, and that's why when we say \$30 will help feed 3

children for the next several months, that's the truth. But that \$30 is critical. The \$50 for 5 children, \$100 for 10 children is critical, because we have 350,000 children we feed every single day, and that's only because of viewers like you.
