“Water For LIFE”

SHEILA WALSH: Hi, I’m Sheila Walsh, welcome to “Life Today.” If I was to ask you what’s the number-one problem facing children in the world today, I wonder if you would come up with this answer, it’s a lack of clean drinking water.

Do you know that the leading cause of death in children under five years of age, globally is the fact that they have nothing to drink but dirty, contaminated water?

I have walked with mothers, I’ve asked them, “Can I come with you? Can I see where you get your water?” And been absolutely horrified at what I saw.

And yet the thing that is so clear to me is there’s this Sophie’s choice, what do I do? Do I give my child this water that may ultimately cause their death? Or do I give them no water at all, and then watch your child die of thirst?

This problem, according to so many, is the number-one health issue in the world at the moment.

And the thing that grabs me, that strikes me about that is this is—we’re not talking about some horrible disease that people are now in laboratories trying to find a cure for, we’re talking about children dying simply because they have no clean water to drink.

At “Life Today,” this has become a huge burden to us. Once you know of something, you’re responsible, then, for what you’re gonna do.

So what I want to ask you today is—I wanna ask you to just pay attention. There’s some things that I wanna show you, some places that I’ve gone, some places that some of my friends have gone, and I just wanna ask you to watch.

And then I want to ask you to respond in whatever way. How do these pictures, how do these mothers’ prayers impact you?

I thought I understood the problem until I hit the ground the very first time in Angola for myself, and it’s one thing to watch something on television and think, wow, that looks really terrible.

It's quite another, it's quite another to sit with a mother who has lost a child simply because she couldn't give them anything clean to drink.

And you might think, well, that's happening somewhere else in the world. Yes, but if you, like me, want to live a life that honors God, if you, like me, want to be the hands and feet of Jesus, then we have an opportunity to reach out to these mums and let them know you're not alone, we see you.

And perhaps you and I together can do something.

But first of all, would you watch this?

SHEILA: Does the water ever make the children sick?

MALE: Yes, they do.

SHEILA: Would you ask her if any of the children in this village have died from drinking the water.

[speaking foreign language]

SHEILA: Okay, so she's gonna take us, and we'll get to see with our own eyes the kind of water that is her only choice to give her children.

Oh my gosh. This is what she comes to. I mean, this water is filthy.

You know, I noticed the mom, she kind of tried to, like, clear it as if somehow that would get rid of the germs or would get rid of the disease, but I mean, you can see this water is.

I mean, it's absolutely filthy. I mean, look at what she's pouring in here.

And this is all they have, and I asked them, are you—do you drink this? And she said, yeah, we just, we wait till the mud settles and then we drink it.

And so that's why so many children in these villages are dying, because there's so much disease in this water, and that's why water for life literally means that.

When we put up a well in a village, we give life to the whole village for their whole life, and the need is urgent, and the need is now.

Will you please stand with us? Will you help us to give life to children who otherwise are drinking this and dying?

SHEILA: To say this is wrong is, I mean, I don't even have words.

I can't describe what it was like to be with that mother and her daughters. I mean, everything within me wanted to go and grab it from them, but they've got nothing else.

And something of just her desperation has stayed with me, and honestly, I pray it stays with me for the rest of my life, because as long as that's happening anywhere, I should care.

I watched one of the mums, she took me to a place where two of her children are buried.

I think as a mother, I cannot imagine anything that's a greater grief than burying a child. But to bury a child simply because you could not give them a glass of clean water is just wrong, it's absolutely wrong.

And so that's why here at Life, we are committed to making a change.

What we want to do is we want to put a well into her village, and do you know for \$4800 we can do that?

Now, now to some of you that's nothing, \$4800 is like, you know what? I could do that.

For others, you're like, well, I can't even begin to touch that, but do you know this?

Forty-eight dollars, when you do that and I do that and several others, and we put it together, because for \$48, you're providing water for 10 people for the rest of their lives.

The amazing thing about these wells that we put in, they last for 70 years.

That's like the lifetime of a village.

They don't even need electricity, because sometimes there's no electricity near.

They can be hand-cranked.

You won't believe what it's like when you finally see fresh water come to a village.

You know, Jesus said, "I give living water. Whoever drinks from me will never thirst again."

If you and I, as the body of Christ, want the privilege of letting people know Jesus Christ is the water of life, then we have to meet their immediate need first.

What they need is clean water.

It's not a lot to ask.

That's all they need, and they need it now.

I want to show you another story, and I know sometimes it's tempting just to flip through channels and think I don't wanna know, but I am asking you, will you stay with me here and watch this?

And then see if something in your heart stirs and you think, you know what?

I think I want to join in.

I think I want to make the impossible possible.

We can do it together.

Would you watch this?

SHEILA: I can't even imagine what that is like, to have that beautiful baby boy die in your arms simply because the only water you have to give him is that filthy water.

I mean, what else is she supposed to do?

So many of these places where we go, we're working with the poorest of the poor.

What else is she supposed to do?

There's nothing else.

She can't go somewhere and get—miraculously get clean water or buy bottles of water.

She has nothing.

And now she's praying over her daughter, God please spare the life of my child.

So that's why this is urgent, and I'm asking you to join me today.

Our commitment is—see, the thing is we have our missionary partners already on the ground.

They are just waiting and praying for the resources, so we are the answer to their prayers.

You know, when I said earlier that our wells last for 70 years, that's because they are steel cased, which they need to be in so many of those countries so that they don't fall back in among themselves.

They will last.

It would take a natural disaster to do anything to these wells.

But for \$4800 we can change the life of a whole village.

If you can give \$144, that would give clean water to 30 people for their lifetime.

If you can do \$48, that will give clean water to 10 people for their lifetime.

This morning I was reading through Matthew, and it's a familiar passage, but I guess because this is so much on my heart, it struck me fresh.

It says—and it's talking about finally our life down here is over, and it says this, this is Jesus talking, "For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you, you gave me a drink. I

was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me.”

Then the righteous ones will reply, ““Lord, when did we ever see you hungry, or feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?””

And the king will say, ““I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these, my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me.””

Think about that.

This is a spiritual act of ministering to Christ when we care for the poorest of the poor.

Now, I know that we can't all do everything, but we can all do something.

So if you could give \$4800, fantastic.

That will put a well in a village, and we'll be able to bring you the footage back and show you, look at the difference.

If you can say, you know what?

If we could come in here and drill a well where he could drink off of that water instead of this filthy, dirty water.

I've seen it work before.

I know that it works.

I know that it turns around quickly for these children.

I would rather be a solution than a problem in this world.

So, I know a solution, I've seen it, I know that it works, I've been all around the world with Life Outreach.
