“Water For LIFE”

MALE ANNOUNCER: The following program is sponsored by Friends of Life Outreach International.

ANNOUNCER: On this special episode of “Life Today.”

JAMES ROBISON: And do you know in Matthew 25, he says, when God calls the nations together, and he’s gonna put the goats on the left hand, the sheep on the right, and then he describes the sheep, and Betty, he says, and here’s who they are.

“I was hungry and you gave me to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me to drink, I was hurt, and you cared for me, I was in prison and you visited me.”

And the disciples said, “When did we ever do that?”

And Jesus answered, Betty, “When you did it to the least of these.”

I want us all to give Jesus water, and the way we do it is we give it to the least of these.

ANNOUNCER: Next on “Life Today.”

JAMES: Well, I just gotta be real honest with you, Betty and I are thrilled to be able to visit with you, but both of us came up with a heavy heart today.

I’m James Robison, and Betty, my wife of soon to be 63 years. You’re so beautiful. I love you so much.

I love you too. I wish I could see you. You say you probably wouldn’t like me if you saw me.

Yes, I would. I’d love you if I saw you.

I would love you if you’re like me with the shepherd here with the sheep walking in his shadow, but there’s one up here. That’s me.

He’s had to carry me much of my journey, I think this is an amazing bronze. They just inspired of God. Thank you for the great art piece.

But I want you to know that when I was a young boy and not having a father, not having a stable home.

I was on a visit with the pastor, and his wife had kept me when I was little. And somehow they talked about Jesus on the cross, said, "I'm thirsty."

And I listened as they said they gave him vinegar and gall. They heard him when he made his only personal request, "I'm thirsty."

And I sat there as a very young boy, early teens. And I said, "I wanna give Jesus a drink of water."

Well, let me just tell you, because of people like you who are watching us, we've given millions of people a fresh clean drink of water, the only water they ever had.

You know, we put way over 9,000 water wells in villages. We've given water to millions and millions of people, and I say we, it's us together. And I just wanna thank you so much.

And today we're asking you to help us drill 350 more water wells. We found those areas. My mind just jumped and said I wish it could be thousands of water wells.

Well, it has been over the years and 350 right now, and financial loads have been very heavy for many people, including us.

And I'm saying, God, we need a miracle. Who everybody would say what I said I wanna say as a young boy, I wanna give Jesus water.

And do you know, in Matthew 25 he says, when God calls the nations together to separate the sheep from the goats, there's gonna be that great dividing?

And he's gonna put the goats on the left hand, the sheep on the right, and then he describes the sheep, and Betty, he says, and here's who they are.

"I was hungry and you gave me to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me to drink, I was hurt and you cared for me, I was in prison and you visited me."

And the disciples said, "When did we ever do that?"

And Jesus answered, Betty, "When you did it to the least of these. When you did it to the most overlooked, forgotten people on the planet, you did it to me."

I want us all to give Jesus water, and the way we do it is we give it to the least of these.

Betty, I'm praying for a miracle, the greatest outpouring of support we've ever seen.

Where we could know the 350 that we're drilling now to touch those thousands of people and given their only fresh, clean water they've ever had, it could be multiplied many times.

I want you to just look at this overview of the desperate need for the water, and we can provide it. Watch.

ANNOUNCER: One hundred-hours. On average, that's how long the human body can survive without water.

In the face of death by dehydration, water like this is the only choice for many.

Recently, while in East Africa, we spoke with Fatina, a mother personally impacted by this crisis.

ANNOUNCER: Unclean water is a common hardship throughout the world, and when something is common, it's easy to get used to.

But should losing a child ever be something we get used to?

Contaminated water has already taken Fatina's son.

In Cambodia, Samnang lost his daughter to a waterborne illness.

Miriam Venegis from Central America stands by the grave of her 5-month-old baby boy who died from drinking contaminated water.

It came from this river, the only source Miriam has available to her.

His death still haunts Miriam to this day, knowing clean water could have prevented it.

For years, you've helped Life Outreach provide clean water in thousands of areas across the globe.

Right now mothers like Fatina also need clean water in their villages before tragedy strikes again.

JAMES: Oh, boy, I'm telling you I've just got such a burden that every one of you watching would say I'm gonna provide water for those families, answer prayer for those mothers, for grandparents.

Please, just say, God, what can I do? And do the best you can.

I mean, just think about it, \$48 will give 10 people water the rest of their life, Betty.

A gift of 144 will give 30 people water for life.

Think about a water well in an area giving 1,000 people water, fresh water they've never had, and we've been doing that now to where we're up well over 9,000 wells together with you, and we ask you to join us to drill another 350.

Could you make a gift to give the people that I just referenced the \$48, 10 people, 144, 30 people the rest of their life?

I want you to watch this incredible piece.

Betty, and I know your heart is heavy with mine that we become an answer to those mother's prayers.

Well, what do you feel right now as we're about to look at this very powerful review of what we have seen and dealt with in Africa and all over the world.

BETTY ROBISON: Well, you know, James, my heart is, of course, as a parent and a grandmother and great grandmother is I watched that father. He was weeping.

I watched that mother saying, "I don't wanna lose the rest of my children," knowing that the next drink of water they offer that child could kill them.

I just can't imagine the heartache they must feel knowing that the next drink they give their child may be death to them.

Please watch closely as we try to communicate the love of Jesus and what he would have us to do to reach out and save the lives of these precious little ones.

JAMES: And even as you watch these images, knowing that love flowing through us is the only hope.

You just ask God, God, show me what I can do.

Watch closely and prayerfully.

ANNOUNCER: When water like this is your only choice, you drink it.

Otherwise, in three to five days without water, you can die due to dehydration.

Delfina, now 58 years of age, has fought this battle her whole life, needing to give her children water to live, but having no other choice but to collect it from unsafe sources like this.

The result, most of her children died from fever, vomiting, and diarrhea brought on by waterborne diseases.

Now as a grandmother, her life of sorrow continues with the recent death of her granddaughter.

ISAK PRETORIUS: I asked her how it feels when she thinks of the children that she's lost, and she just weeps as she remembers and then shares the pain and the struggle of seeing her children go through that, of losing her children, the pain and the struggle that she's experienced as a mother, not being able to give her children clean water, water that doesn't kill you.

Yet when asked what she would say to those who could make it possible, and her response was that she would plead with us to be able to do that, but she said, "Not just for me, not just for my children, for all the mothers here, for all the children, for our whole community, because they're all suffering the same."

Like me, you can't imagine losing just one of your children, let alone multiple children.

I can't imagine the heartbreak and the anguish of experiencing that.

Well, I'm asking you from that heart to join hearts with us and partner with us to make sure that we can bring fresh, clean, life-giving water, not the water of death, but the water of life to this mother, to her children and grandchildren, to the other mothers in this community that she literally speaks on their behalf, to the other precious children, the ones who are still here but are still suffering.

JAMES: Well, I could hold every one of them in my arms if I could, and boy, we've held thousands of them.

You know, for more than 30 years now, we've been drilling wells, and it's just an amazing thing that God has done, and I'm asking for the greatest outpouring we've ever witnessed today.

If there's any way you could help drill a well, many of our viewers tell us the greatest joy they have is drilling an entire well, \$4800, but others also say that, you know, when we give \$1200 or \$2400, we've given a fourth or a half, and we pray others will join us.

And that's the way we get the wells, and we're asking you right now, just ask God, what do you want me to do?

He's gonna show you how to do it.

Then I'm asking you, please, I mean, even now, you get your bank card, or you get your checkbook, and you be prepared to go online or call the number and use that card or write a check, but call and let us know it's going in the mail, because you gotta know you're gonna be able to drill those 350 wells, and maybe this will help do even more.

Please let God direct you as you give.

ANNOUNCER: Each day, women in this region of South Asia walk for miles, spending hours to provide water for their families.

Amarriti, a single mom, travels in this boat to collect water from the middle of the lake.

She says the water here is cleaner and does not smell as bad as the water close to the shore.

But the reality is the distance is no guarantee the water is safe.

ANNOUNCER: This is Varju, a grandmother several times over.

She will make four to five trips each day, walking these steep, rocky hills for more than two miles to collect her water from this open pit.

The daily trip not only takes a toll on her physically, but the water makes her and her grandchildren sick.

ANNOUNCER: For Janku to meet her family's needs for just one day, she must go morning, noon, and evening to this stream to collect her water.

She pours it through this cloth in an effort to strain out the impurities, but even with her best efforts, this water often turns deadly.

ANNOUNCER: Thousands of women like Amarriti, Varju, and Janku have spent their entire lives striving to collect the cleanest water they can.

The reality is they are bringing diseased water to their families because they have no other choice.

But the good news is we can give them a choice by drilling water wells in their villages.

Once the fresh, clean water is capped with a hand pump, people can be freed from the hardships of spending hours collecting water.

And more importantly, waterborne illnesses and disease will be a thing of the past.

JAMES: Oh boy, I want that so badly for people.

You know, this past Christmas was 13 Christmases, 13 years ago we said goodbye to our daughter, our little miracle baby girl that we weren't supposed to be able to have anymore.

And Robin was the greatest picture of Jesus and his love for 40 years.

She led and inspired people.

And we had to say goodbye.

She didn't die for lack of water, she died of cancer that finally ate into her intestines.

I know many of you prayed for us, and Betty, there's not a person watching that if they had known a perfect cure, they would have driven all the way across the country.

They would have done whatever it took to bring us that cure for our daughter.

I know you would have.

Well, would you please offer the perfect cure?

Betty, that's what we want the perfect cure for all these precious children that mothers care so much about and the families.

Please, we want this to be the greatest miracle outpouring of support we've ever witnessed.

We have 350 areas we've selected to drill wells.

He says, "I'm right here. I'll never leave you or forsake you."

And these mothers that have just walked, they walk—they would walk to the ends of the earth to help their child, but they have nowhere else to go, no other water supply, and we have been there, we've seen the sadness of it, but also we've seen the joy of it.

We've been there as the water well was drilling.

The water came forth.

We jumped back, you remember, in excitement, because we knew what that water well was gonna do, it's gonna save so, so many lives.

Please join with us.

Let's do it together.

Help us, please, to drill these water wells.

JAMES: And I really do pray that you will give the best gift you can and let us send you this beautiful bronze, because you will know this shepherd has carried many you know and wants to carry many you know and has likely carried you.
